

The reason we implemented the occasional Saturday Technical Seminars was to address this matter. However, if you don't attend, you and your car don't benefit. Several of our club members have earned the prestigious 5000 mile award, signifying that they drove their Model A more than 5000 miles in a 12 month period. Whatever your reason for acquiring a Model A it usually wasn't for show purposes only (there are a few exceptions). Get the most out of owning it – drive it. Let your club help you put it on the road.



### "SWEETHEART" PANCAKE BREAKFAST



Following breakfast at the Golden Corral, we proceed to Richard Dunevent's garage for the day's activities. Using Mike Chavis's 1931 Cabriolet as the guinea pig, how to assess the condition of your brakes was the focus of the day's activity.



Jim McPherson led seminar on evaluation probbrake lems, starting with the brake pedal and ending with the drums, and the cures available correct each condition.



Sheila McPherson provided the lunch, pulled BBQ sandwiches, cold slaw, potato salad, cookies and cake.
