

Midland Valley Christmas Parade


The Midland Valley Christmas Parade will be held on **Saturday December 9th**. The parade will begin at 3:00 PM.


probably was best known for being the editor of *Ladies Home Journal* and under his leadership the magazine was the first magazine in the world to have one million subscribers.
