Front End Alignment

Craig McMullin called the meeting to order and discussed the situation with MAFCA insurance coverage. At this time there is no MAFCA coverage, and no time frame for future coverage. (See announcement above these minutes for later news regarding the insurance situation,)

Since we are a MARC chapter the STA's are covered and all members who are MARC members. This insurance does not cover any timed events, such as races or hill climbs. Members should be covered by individual liability coverage, and it is the responsibility of each member to have this coverage. Some discussion followed concerning encouraging members to become MARC members.

The budget was discussed, and it was decided to include the membership collected in 2006 for the year 2007 in the 2007 budget.

Future Activities were discussed. A trip to Greenville in the fall was discussed, but tabled until definite plans were made concerning a trip to Washington, GA. Other activities were discussed for a possible drive and dinner during the slack summer months. Members would be notified on short notice by e-mail. Effort would be made to get current e-mail addresses, and a short call list could be prepared for interested members without e-mail. The August dinner meeting was discussed. We will ask Betty Wade to get more specifics from the caterer she suggested.

Several members were assigned to the refreshment roster for June, and several others added to July.




Saint Patrick's Day Parade - green Model A's Everywhere!


It was a beautiful day for Augusta's Annual St Patrick's Day Parade. We had eighteen Model A's all decorated for the occasion and loaded with kids and grandkids. The lineup of Model A's was led by the "Taxi Lady" in her 1930 Taxi, Bill and Gale Adams in their 1931 DeLuxe Coupe, Travis Starr in his 1931 Coupe, George and Christine Gordon in their 1929 Pickup, Jerome Trap with his 1928 Special Coupe and 1929 Town Sedan, Craig McMullin in his 1930 Fordor, Larry Komp in his 1928 Tudor, Bobby Markwalter driving Richard Dunevent's 1930 Tudor, Gerald Melchiors in his 1930 Cabriolet, Richard Dunevent driving Bill Maypole's 1931 DeLuxe Roadster, Rex and Karen Foster in their 1930 Fordor, James Gay in his 1928 Tudor, Ernie Dinking in his 1931 Coupe, Doug Wilson in his 1929 Pickup, Carol Taylor in her 1930 Coupe, Jim and Sheila McPherson in their 1930 Town Sedan, and Walter Smith in his 1929 Fordor. After the parade fifteen members went to Fire Mountain in North Augusta for lunch.



Old tricks to improve the braking on the Model A continue to surface. Since the rear brakes are considered to "float", these improvements have focused on the front brakes and how to make them float. There have been modifications to the stud guiding the operating wedge, replacement of the wedge with a toggle linkage to allow equalization, and the most recently (and drastic) changes with the New Zealand modifications.

Recently another method has surfaced from Harry Smith, a member of the Alabama Rambling A's. It concerns modifying the front brake adjusting wedge. Remove the brake adjusting wedge from the backing plate by unscrewing it.





Note: this material is very hard and you may need to use a grinding wheel.

Then place the wedge back in its' original position. Take a bolt with the **<u>same</u>** thread as the adjusting wedge, add a thin locking nut and screw it into the housing until it contacts the adjusting wedge.

Adjust the brake shoe contact with the drum with the bolt, as you would normally do using the brake adjusting wedge. <u>Tighten the lock nut.</u>

The brake wedge now floats, allowing the brake shoes to center themselves!

VINTAGE VISIONS


By Deborah Fuller Spring and Easter Bonnets in the Model A Era

In 1948 Irving Berlin wrote. In your Easter bonnet, with all the frills upon it You'll be the grandest gal in the Easter Parade. I'll be all in clover and when they look you over We'll be the proudest couple in the Easter Parade. Irving Berlin's "Easter Parade" (1948)



It is believed that the Easter Parade began in New York City in the 1870's. The Easter Parade in New York was and still is an extremely popular event. Originally, the church goers would carry Easter flowers in the parade from St Thomas Church to St Luke's Church. In this one block parade it became a traditional rite of spring to be seen in your new spring fashions which included hats. As the event became more popular the parade was extended from Madison Square to Central Park.





Hats of the late 1920's to the 1930's were the popular clouche. This hat was fashionable from 1908 to 1933. The shape resembled a helmet. To be worn correctly the hat had to be all but pulled over the eyes, making the wearer have to life up the head, whilst peering snootily down the nose.

Art Deco influence can be seen in the zigzag seaming and construction lines on many cloche hats. The rich noticed these discreet clever differences but the severely rich and chic women favored the understated effect of single diamond clip.

The harsh style of the cloche was made more acceptable by the use of make-up. Make-up became the epitome of sophisticated chic and self-assurance. When a woman publicly applied make-up from a glamorous compact when in a restaurant or dance hall, she was exhibiting the new symbol of womanly grace and refinement.

Easter Bonnets, Cloche hats, whatever you want to call them, but worn on Easter Sunday is a form of expression. The lady that chooses her adornment carefully will experience the joy of saying spring has arrived and so have I.
