

If you have any feeling that you might like to go. I would encourage you to make your hotel reservations now. The host hotel is the Woodlands Hotel & Suites (Deluxe Suites \$179, Superior Room Class, \$137), and the overflow hotel is the Cascades Motel (\$116). Additional lodging is available in the Governor's Inn (\$105) and the Williamsburg Lodge (\$179). Reservations for any of the above hotels may be made by calling 1-800-261-9530. Most of the national chain motels we usually stay in are full. Some of us will be staving at the Quality Inn Colony (309 Page St) at a rate of \$62.96/\$53.96 (click on the 50+ rate) from their web site (www.choicehotels.com).

You may want to visit the Williamsburg Meet website (http://clubs.hemmings.com/colvamodela/) for a preview of what awaits you at the MARC National Meet.

One note: to register for this meet you must be a member of MARC, so if you plan to attend this meet, you might consider becoming a member now, to take full advantage of your membership (and the Model A News magazine).

NOTES FROM THE MODEL A GARAGE

The announcement has been made, and conversion will soon start on an alcohol plant in Augusta. However, the alcohol will not be derived from corn as it is in the mid-west, but from wood pulp. We might consider converting our Model A's to operate on this newer fuel source. I guess we will be able to tell everybody we are burning wood to run our Model A engines as a conservation effort!

Many Model A owners have placed a safety fuse at the starter to protect the electrical system. There was an interesting tip in Henry's Horn, the newsletter of the Henry's A's Chapter in Livermore, CA on just this topic. Instead if using a safety fuse, they suggest using a circuit breaker, which fits the fuse holder. They replaced the 30 amp fuse with a 30 amp circuit breaker available from Peterbilt truck dealers. It snaps into the fuse holder with no modifications. The part number is CC1630 and it cost about \$17.00. If you have trouble finding a fuse when you need to replace one, or if your electrical system has a tendency to frequently blow a fuse, this may be a good solution for you.




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

In the Sears catalog we see wool broadcloth and velour, and in 1930 a combination of wool and silk. A number of coats had a large mushroomtype fur collar. Many of these collars were made from wolf dog fur as well as that from a few other animals.





fashions tended to be little ahead of those generally seen. The coats seen in Sears and Wards catalogue a re somewhat straighter in 1929, but are more fitted in 1930 and 31.

The picture to the left shows coats from a 1930 McCall's. The coats are more fitted and often belted at the waist. The dark gray coat (2nd from right) features a fitted circular skirt with a tie waist and a bloused bodice.
