## Tech Tip of the Month: Ethanol-Free Gas

**December 2010:** Ethanol continues to be a problem for our Model A's, whether it is reacting with the older gas tank sealers or storage when we are not regularly driving our cars. There is a website, **pure-gas.org**, that lists the gas stations selling ethanol-free gas by state and city. From looking at

the list of brands that <u>do</u> sell ethanol free gas, it might not hurt to stop at one of the branded stations not listed and ask if they have ethanol free gas. Also, ethanol free gas is available in all three grades of gas, and some stations may carry it only in their premium grade of gas. Here is a list for our area. I know of one station not listed by them, in New Ellenton, SC. (*The editors also know of a couple more stations in the Aiken area*)

## 1929: Elmer Sas' Tudor Budget Bank

It's a 6 x 6 metal box—basically you're looking at six piggy banks in one— and unlocking the box reveals the separate tins fitted inside. It even has circular openings for rolled-up bills. *\*Picture to the right shows box upside down.* 

Elmer Sas invented and patented the Budget Bank in 1929, and it was a huge success in Depression-era America. The bank originally came with suggested labels for the half-dozen slots, including setting aside some of your coinage for charities like the Red Cross. On the strength of this product, Sas founded Tudor Metal Products and in the 1940's went on to create his most famous invention - Electric Football; that rattling metallic gridiron that you can still get today. I still have my father's Budget Bank. Imagine my surprise when I learned it was invented during our Model A era! When I was a kid, Dad would cash his paycheck each month and use five of the boxes to set aside money for the various necessities of life—rent, food, car, clothing, utilities. The sixth box bore the label 'H.O.K'. "What's that for?", I asked. "Heaven Only Knows", he answered.
