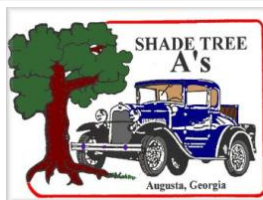
The Shade Tree A's is a non-profit organization with chapter affiliations with MAFCA and MARC

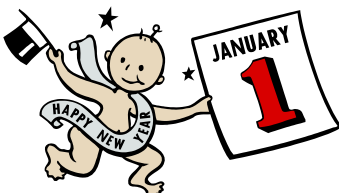

He has restored his own Model A; but more importantly in the spirit of this award, he has helped many other Club members in the restoration of their Model A and countless others in the diagnosis, repair, and maintenance

of Model A problems. In fact, he is the first person thought of when it comes to timing a Model A Ford.

While often in the background, he readily offers new insight to Model A repair and maintenance techniques at Club meetings and Technical Seminars. He offers encouragement and mentoring to new members. He routinely gives 110 percent effort to any task.

He has been active with his Model A in all types of Club activities, including tours, parades, displays, picnics and meetings. He has attended MARC, MAFCA and AACA National Meets, and has shown his 1931 Model A Coupe in MAFCA National competitions. He represents the Shade Tree A's well at these and other events. Exceptionally well known throughout the Southeast region, he is often one of the first names mentioned when discussing the Shade Tree A's. For many years he has been and continues to be an outstanding ambassador for the Club.



He was a very close friend of Monroe and the two were often seen working together on a Model A solving the problem of the day. I know Monroe, if he was still with us, would have whole-heartily approved and been honored with this year's award recipient.

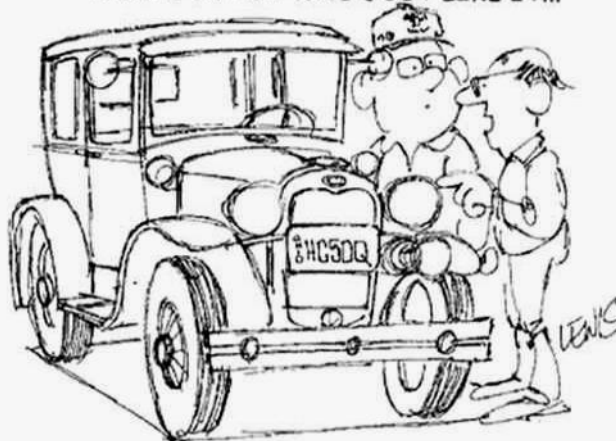

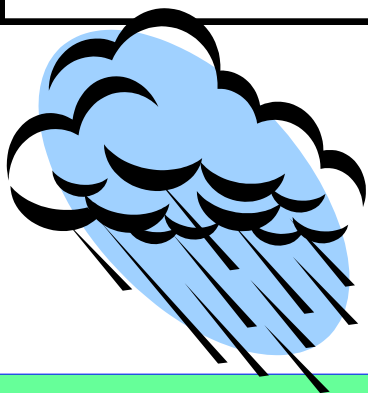

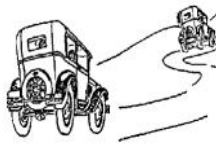
NEW YEAR'S BREAKFAST Friday, January 1

DIRECTIONS TO THE McMULLIN'S HOME (SEE COVER FOR PARTY INVITATION)

Starting from Aiken (total distance 22 miles, 31 minutes)

Laurens Street is SC-19

Continue going North on SC-19 passing I-20 (total 15.9 miles)

At the Pine House Crossroads (Pine House on left, truck stop on right), which is the Intersection of US 25 and US 121, continue straight onto US 25 N. (SC-19 ends at this intersection) (5.5 miles) ****for continuation, see next column**

Starting from Augusta (total distance from the river 25 miles, 35 minutes)

Take I-20 towards Columbia, SC

Take Exit 5 (the second exit in South Carolina) towards Edgefield (this is Highway 25).

At the Pine House Crossroads (Pine House on left, truck stop on left across intersection), which is the Intersection of US 25/121 and US 19, turn left onto US 25 N (5.5 miles)

**** (from here the directions are the same)**

As you enter Edgefield, you'll pass our McDonald's and the Edgefield Inn on the left, bear to the right and continue on US 25 Business (US 25 Truck Route goes to the left)

You will go under an overpass with a "Welcome to Edgefield" sign

You will pass by the Strom Thurmond Army National Guard on the right

At the next intersection, with the flowered median, turn right onto SC 23 towards Johnston and Columbia

This is Columbia Road

You will pass a small park on the right

We live at 425, which will be on your left. (0.4 miles)

Our driveway is directly across from the next road on the right (Slade Road) Look for the "Mott Parker House - 1899" sign in our front yard.

It is a white two-story with brick walkways; there is plenty of parking in the back or you may park on the street

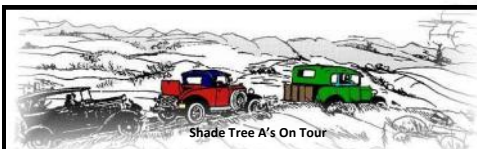
