

# TIME TO TAKE CHARGE

A few weeks ago I did my first unsupervised oil change.

When I bought my 1928 Roadster in the summer of 2008, I had been convinced by #1 son, Brian, that I could maintain it myself. That sounded good until we got it home and it hardly ran. For the first two and a half years I had it, it was one thing after another. Every time I though it was roadworthy, something else would come up. Since mid-August it's been a pretty reliable car. I've been able to take it on quite a few day trips with the club and I regularly take it to run errands around town.

I recently found out that Brian will be moving to Switzerland in February so I decided I'd better start dealing with the maintenance myself instead of waiting until he visits Aiken. So earlier this month I changed the starter switch (with some guidance from Tom Roberts) and recently I drained the radiator and added antifreeze, changed the oil, and inadvertently changed the transmission fluid.

I scooted under the car (if I gain another ounce, I'll have to jack the car up to do this – it's a very tight fit sliding under the running board while lying on the creeper!). That's when I realized I was too far back for that to be the oil pan (maybe I did need supervision after all). Well, I got Brian on the phone and he said the transmission fluid needed changing anyway. Fortunately, I had exactly enough 600-weight oil left in the jug to fill the transmission; I bet there's not a tablespoon to spare!

All's well that ends well. The worst part of the job was getting the black grease out from under my nails...

# TECH TIP Water Temperature

Peyton Quina, a member of the Jacksonville A's had some interesting contributions on water temperature in their newsletter. His engine builder feels that the Model A runs best in the 180/190 degree range. Contributors from the Ford Barn Model A forum believe the engine temperature should be kept under 200 degrees. Further discussion indicates a 160 degree thermostat starts to open at 160, and isn't fully open until 180. Yet many Model A owners claim their temperature gauge remains on 160 during the entire driving range. Era original Rex-A-Co temperature gauges indicate 190 degrees as the beginning of the danger zone (190-240). If your Model A is running between 180 and 190 degrees, a temperature gauge might be a distraction. Payton flushed his cooling system with three vinegar treatments, each with two gallons of vinegar and one gallon distilled water, followed with one final treatment using one gallon Simple Green and two gallons distilled water. Payton's Model A runs a steady 180 degrees on long drives with slightly higher readings at lengthy idle on a 90 degree day.

# RICHLAND CREEK OLD FARM DAYS


November 5

# EARLY GAS PUMP


Richland Creek Farm Rachel d'Entremont

Just before the Richland Creek Farm tour on November 5, I had been reading about early gas stations in an article from the National Park Service Historic Preservation Brief. Not 24 hours later, I came face-to-face with a Beman Automatic Curb Cabinet in one of the barns at the Richland Creek Farm. From what I can gather, the gas was stored in a tank underground and pumped up with a hand pump similar to a bicycle tire pump. # MAFFI MUSEUM UP DATE

MAFFI Trustees

The early events for constructing the Model A Ford Museum building are underway. A topographic survey has been done and a site plan is being started. The final design contract will be signed by the end of the month. Meanwhile



a MAFFI team is conducting a visual inspection and inventory of existing museum display items.

The fund drive to pay for the museum is continuing. MAFFI now has a broker (Edward Jones) and can accept gifts of stock and if you have an IRA that requires a mandatory distribution that you don't need, you can donate the distribution to the museum and not have to pay taxes on it.

Each club can help and many are. For example, clubs are holding special events to raise money for the museum. Illinois Region of MARC had a swap meet, Grape Country A's had an auction, both resulting in substantial donations How about your club holding a road rally or a poker run, a car wash, or a brakes inspection day, each with a fee to go to the museum. Other fun events might include a Biggest Loser contest among portly club members with the monthly collections based on promised versus actual weight loss, all going to the museum fund. Another idea is to charge "tuition" for an all-day technical seminar (valve grinding, transmission rebuild, etc) with proceeds going to the museum. Perhaps a simple Museum 50/50 at each meeting - no donation is too small and no donation is too big. You'll have fun and also get a museum.

# **CHRISTMAS PARADE DETAILS**

The Gibson Christmas Parade will be held on Saturday December 3rd. We will meet at the Walmart on Deans Bridge Road and Bobby Jones Expressway and leave at 1:00 pm for Gibson. We will stop for lunch along the way. The parade line-up is at 2 o'clock at the High School, and the parade begins at 3 o'clock.

The GVW (Graniteville-Vaucluse-Warrenville) Parade is Saturday, December 3 at 3:00. The parade will begin in the parking lot of Leavelle McCampbell Middle School and proceed through Graniteville on Highway 191 to end at the traffic light at Highway 421 in Warrenville. Lineup is at 2:00.

The Thompson Parade will be on Sunday, Dec. 4th at 3 pm with a 2pm line up at the Thompson Brickyard football field (same place as last year). The STA participation is sponsored by the Thompson Meat Packing Co. at \$10 per car.

The Gracewood Christmas Parade will be held on Tuesday December 6th. The parade line-up will be on the baseball field at 12:15. Going South on Peach Orchard Road, turn left on Tobacco Road and take the first right (beside the Gracewood campus) to the ball field. The parade begins at One o'clock. The rain date is Wednesday December 7th.

The Aiken Christmas Parade will be held Sunday, December 11th at 2:00. Line-up begins at 1:00, and the Jaycees will notify each entrant of lineup location and entry positions prior to the parade. The parade will be televised live on WJBF News Channel 6 AND Aiken Standard's ASTV (12.2). Candy/literature cannot be thrown or passed out during the parade—strictly enforced by Aiken Public Safety.

The Hephzibah Christmas Parade will be held Saturday December 17th at 11 o'clock. Line-up at the High School beginning at 10 o'clock. At the end of the parade route, turn left and we will remove the decorations from our Model A's at the old Elementary School before heading down Windsor Spring Road to Sconyer's for lunch. If you are unable to make the parade, maybe you can join us for lunch about one o'clock.

- ♦ The football team of Honorary Youth Member Houston Barbee won the championship title for his league. Congratulations Houston!



- •Take I-20 towards Columbia, SC

- •At the Pine House Crossroads (Pine House on left, truck stop on left across intersection), which is the Intersection of US 25/121 and US 19, turn left onto US 25 N. (5.5 miles)
