

YOU ARE INVITED.....






-TECH TIP -Shock Absorbers Jim McPherson

During the Model A era, the fluid of choice to refill your shock absorber was glycerin. While still available today in drug stores, the problem with its use, then and now, is that glycerin absorbs water from the air. A modern shock absorber fluid is available from Model A parts suppliers, or you may use hydraulic jack fluid. If your shock(s) are leaking past the rubber seal around the shaft that holds the shock arm, you may want to add STP in increase the viscosity of the fluid and stop the leak. -

McCall's always showed the latest styles from Paris so the ladies at the time had the patterns available to them. I doubt the average lady of the time could have afforded to make a coat like this as it was the Depression and times were tough, but I guess if they could afford the magazine at 10 cents per copy, they could dream.

Pattern # 6119

Typical of the new coats for practical wear is one cut on princess lines with double-breasted front closing and a narrow belt designed to mark the waistline.

Pattern # 6247

A flattering type coat has one of the new up-standing collars to frame the face, sleeves that widen toward the elbow and circular flounce to add fullness.
