Eric checked the oil filler tube and noticed that there was the tell-tale milky look that indicated a blown head gasket. The dipstick registered absolutely no oil. (For those of you thinking I was delinquent in checking the oil, I had probably driven less than 10 miles since the oil was changed.) He added a couple of quarts and while he was on the phone telling Dotti he'd be late, I watched the newly added oil pour out onto the street!

I called AAA and was asked the usual "what is the make and model of your car?" The response to my answer was "Cool". I told her it was a lot more cool when I wasn't stranded on the side of the road. When she asked the color, I was temped to get snarky and say it was the only Model A broken down at that intersection but, since I needed her help, I answered nicely. The tow truck driver also thought it was neat getting to haul a Model A. Glad someone enjoyed the experience.

To those of you who tell me how much you enjoy reading about my amusing car troubles, I need to find a less expensive way to entertain you.

If you see a little old lady in Model A-era clothing selling pencils on the street, please be kind and buy a few from me.



1928 America got a new look in telephones in 1927 when the combined receiver and transmitter idea, used since 1878 by telephone linesmen, was sufficiently improved to be adapted for general service. It was popularly known as the "French phone" because it resembled continental instruments.



This telephone like the 1928 set came with or without dial and resembled its predecessor except that instead of a round base it had an elliptical or oval base. Within a few years after its introduction it was being offered in a variety of finishes including ivory, gray, statuary bronze, oxidized silver and in gold.

DARLINGTON TOUR CANCELLED

This was without success. One of their restrictions was that no one under 18 would drive or ride in the car. We are exploring different avenues for insurance coverage for future club events.


