

Former MAFCA President Jerry Wilhelm

At the November Shade Tree A's meeting, Don Turley mentioned the death of Jerry Wilhelm that many Shade Tree A's members knew. The following memorial is provided by MAFCA.

It is with a heavy heart that MAFCA announces the death of Jerry Wilhelm, MAFCA President 1989 & 1991. Jerry Edward Wilhelm, 78, of Lithia, FL, passed away peacefully with his wife beside him, on Friday, November 11, 2016, at Sun City Center Hospice House, in Sun City Center, FL. Born in Cleveland, OH, on July 12, 1938. Jerry was the son of Joseph E. and Rita Marie Wilhelm. He attended St Joseph High School in Cleveland, and John Carroll University in University Heights, OH. Jerry grew up in Cleveland and also served in the United States Army Reserves for six years. Jerry was owner and President of Avery Engineering Co., a commercial heating and air conditioning design-build contractor in Cleveland until he retired to Vero Beach, FL in 1999, where he met and married his beloved wife, Gay. Jerry's first love was Model A Fords, the friends and everything surrounding them. Jerry was the consummate "car guy" for over 50 years and had 35 Model A's at one time. Jerry was deeply involved with MAFCA (Model A Ford Club of America), happily



serving as President for eight years and also as a National Director for many years. Jerry had friends all over the country and was respected and admired for his knowledge and willingness to share with anyone interested in Model As. Jerry loved traveling around the country to car meets, tours, and events. He was a well-respected master judge with AACA (Antique Auto Club of America) and judged at various car shows. After he met his wife Gay, who then became his first love, they made many trips together to Model A events, and wherever they were, they were always hand in hand. Jerry's favorite trip was the annual Hershey car show and swap meet in Hershey, PA, and he made that at least 45 times. Jerry was unwavering in his loyalty to his wife, family, and his love of cars. He was gentle, constant, and true to all who knew him. He found the goodness in everything and everyone. Jerry was an extraordinary man and will be forever missed. In addition to his loving wife Gay (Jackson) Wilhelm, Jerry is survived by sisters Donette Wanen of Chagrin Falls, OH, and Lynette Padula of Cleveland. Jerry is also survived by his very-loved stepfamily, stepsons, Randy Ubillos and husband Rick Fath of San Francisco, CA, Dr. Scott and wife Dena Ubillos of Lithia, FL, stepdaughter Pam and husband Matt Rivet of N. Andover, MA, and stepson David Barker and partner Kevin Summers of Ft. Lauderdale, FL. 

He still holds the track record for the fastest qualifying speed (212.809 MPH) at Talladega and Daytona International Speedway (210.364 MPH). Both records were set in 1987. TECHNICAL TOPICS

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

The ammeter as a diagnostic tool. In 1929 Ford moved the black primary wire that runs to the ignition coil from the passenger side of the terminal box on the firewall to the driver's side of the terminal box (Service Bulletin, page 390, November 1929). The purpose of this change is to have the ignition current pass through the ammeter to provide a diagnostic tool when starting the engine.

If your Model A is wired in this manner, the ammeter provides a diagnostic tool for your use. When starting the Model A the ammeter will bounce back and forth on either side of the zero mark before it starts. This is caused by the points opening and closing. If the car fails to start, the bouncing ammeter needle is telling you that there is nothing wrong with the ignition primary electrical circuit and the problem is somewhere else. If the needle is not bouncing, the problem is likely elsewhere in the ignition primary electrical circuit. When you park your Model A, the ammeter needle should be pointing to zero. If instead the needle is pointing slightly to the left, it is telling you that somewhere within the electrical system there is current flowing, which is going to drain the battery. The cause of this drain may be as simple as the headlights or dome light being left on, or the brake light switch being on. If you have a generator, the contact points in the cut-out may stick closed causing a discharge to be displayed on the ammeter. When you start your Model A and the engine speed increases, these points should close and the ammeter should show a positive charge to the right, telling you the generator is functioning normally. If you have replaced the generator with an alternator, the positive charge returning to zero tells you the alternator is functioning normally; however, if the needle remains to the right for an extended period of time, it may be telling you that you may have a dead cell in your battery. To check that your alternator is working, drive your Model A until the ammeter needle has returned to zero and then turn on your headlamps. You should see a sudden movement of the needle and a return to zero, indicating your alternator is working correctly.

One way to tell if you have an original ammeter is they have a "bounce" to them. This is because they are un-damped, and they quickly respond to any variations in current flow. Many reproduction ammeters are not made very well and are damped and move very sluggishly.

While driving your Model A, occasionally touch the ammeter. If it is warm to the touch, remove the instrument panel and tighten the two nuts on the back of the ammeter. These nuts tend to loosen over time creating an increased resistance in the connection, and the heat generated by this condition could result in melting of the insulation on the wires and a fire.
