This year's recipient of the Monroe Wade award is Curtis Krosting. Congratulations Curtis and well deserved.


All members were reminded of the MARC/MAFCA scholarship award. Every one is asked to donate \$1 at the January meeting to this endeavor.





# And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

The Battery. Battery life in the Model A is viewed by many to be relatively short, one to two years. That is probably our fault. With the battery located under the floorboard it is out of sight and difficult to access. Regular maintenance extends the life of a battery, and with the location of the Model A battery it is just too easy to put off. Battery maintenance includes keeping the terminals clean and protected against corrosion. Even a small amount of corrosion can have a huge impact on the charging system's ability to recharge a battery. A prolonged undercharged condition dramatically reduces battery life. There are several ways to protect your battery from corrosion; felt impregnated rings that go under the battery terminals, a spray protectant and Vaseline are a few.

If your battery is in a drained condition, maybe from your Model A not being run in some time, use a battery charger at its lowest setting to bring it back to a full charge. Driving our Model A's for short trips with a drained battery, even if it starts, shortens the battery life. Charging a battery just enough to start the car is a bad idea because driving a car for short periods on a barely charged battery can shorten its life. You should fully charge the battery before taking a trip.

A battery maintainer is a good way to keep your battery at a full charge and extend its life. Use a battery maintainer if you are not going to drive your Model A for more than a month. Lead-acid batteries, like most of us use, lose up to 25 percent of their charge per month, even in warm weather and when disconnected from the car. A lead-acid battery at 70 degrees F self-discharges about 1 percent a day, so you can see how important it is to maintain your battery.



When purchasing a new battery, it is important to choose a battery with the cold cranking amps (CCA) specified for the Model A. A battery with higher or lower CCA may not perform as well and may actually have a shorter life span. It is very tempting to buy a new battery with higher CCA's, but it might not be in our best interest.

#### **TECHNICAL TOPICS**

The newer, absorbent glass mat (AMG) batteries are designed to withstand deeper and more frequent discharge rates and cycles, such as a hard to start Model A or driving short distances. They have fiberglass mats between the battery plates to hold the electrolyte. Several Model A owners have switched to this type battery and are reporting battery life of 10-12 years. It is important to secure any battery in its battery box, and that is especially true with the AMG batteries. One important caution when using these batteries, you cannot charge them with a conventional 10 amp battery charger. The high amperage charge shorts out the battery inside. You can charge these batteries successfully with a battery maintainer. OPTIMA is one such brand.





And if you are in need of a jump-start, remember to connect the cables correctly for a safe start. Depending upon the ground of your vehicle, connect the positive cable clamp to the positive terminal on the dead vehicle and clamp on the other end to the positive battery terminal on the good vehicle. Then connect the negative cable clamp to the metal engine part far away from the dead battery before connecting the other clamp to the negative battery post on the good vehicle. Remove the cables in the reverse order. Let the dead vehicle battery charge for at least five minutes before you try starting.
