


THE SHADE TREE A'S - THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

The June 1988 issue of the Shade Tree A's Newsletter discussed a show and tell item presented at the May 1988 meeting, a magnetic oil drain plug. The plug was touted as cheap insurance for cars without oil filters like the Model A. An upcoming garage tour was also anticipated. The benefits of sandblasting and advice were discussed in the "President's Column".



TECHNICAL TOPICS

The following Technical Topics were provided by Bentley's Antique Auto Service.

Model A Q&A's

Like always, we've been busy in the shop. Seems like lots of brake and steering work. I believe we could have a full-time shop just doing that kind of work. Of course, I love the restoration work even more, turning rusty, neglected and forgotten cars into something the owners can be proud of and enjoy for years to come. Here are some highlights from the last few weeks.

Question: I was driving my 1930 Coupe the other day, and noticed when I pulled into the driveway there was a trail of oil following me. After I parked the car in the carport for a few minutes there was a very large puddle of oil under the car. It seems to be coming from the housing under the clutch. Is this something easy to fix?

Answer: I hate to be the bearer of bad news, but usually when a Model A engine is losing that much oil it is a sign of a serious engine failure. You can remove the oil pan and check the rear main bearing. There is an oil drain tube that could be your problem, but it's probably a bearing failure. You can avoid this by checking the bearing clearance at least every 5,000 miles. Checking the clearance involves removing the oil pan, and is a bit of a hassle, but it can save you an engine in the long run.

Question: My Model A is a great driver, but I notice when I decelerate down a long hill the car will jump out of high gear. I can watch the gear shift, it just seems to vibrate slowly and move from third gear into neutral. What's going on?

Answer: This is one of the first problems I ever fixed for a customer, years ago when I started working on Model A's. First I tried rebuilding the gear shift tower. This is a fairly easy job, which requires removing the floor boards, and taking the shift tower out. You can replace the shift lever and the spring-loaded detents. This will help a little bit, but more likely you will really need to remove the transmission and replace the input shaft and the high gear slider gear. Over the years these parts get worn and don't mesh properly. Try to find original parts if possible.

Question: I would like to replace the brakes on my Model A Roadster. I was thinking about going to hydraulic brakes. Would this be a good idea? Where can I get the parts?

Answer: Years ago when the junkyards were full of old V8 Fords, it was common for guys to go to the junkyard on a Saturday and pick up everything they needed to convert a Model A to hydraulic brakes. Now those days are long gone, but most of the parts are available new. As far as I know, no one is making a complete kit at this time. To be honest I would rather have an original mechanical brake set up, with new cast iron brake drums and high friction linings. This system is less expensive and like I say, more original to the car, so it is much easier to service and maintain. It's up to you, but I like the original stuff. Les Andrews Model A Mechanics Handbook has excellent information about rebuilding the Model A brakes. I highly recommend this book to anyone who owns a Model A.
