## **Central Alabama Race Track Adventure**

You are invited to attend the Central Alabama Model "A" Ford club's Race Track Adventure March 15- 17, 2018. The meeting will be filled with a lot of activities of fun & excitement including kicking tires with fellow club members from around the south, dinner in a great Model "A" Ford Museum, visiting the Barber Motorsports recently expanded museum and the opportunity to put your Model "A" Ford on the Motorsports track for several laps. For attendees who have never visited the Talladega Speedway an early bird option will be offered, a bus tour of the Talladega Speedway and a visit to the International Motor Sports Hall of Fame museum.

THURSDAY March 15, 2018 (EARLY BIRD OPTION) Arrival and check in at the motel Visit local antique stores looking for those great finds you just cannot do without. Prepare to visit the Talladega Super Speedway tour. The speedway track is 2.66 miles long with 33 degree bank turns, seats 175,000 peoples and cost 4 million dollars to build. The museum tour is a walking self-guided tour that takes approximately an hour to complete the three exhibit halls. A 12 seat bus leaves every 20 minutes for a tour of the track.

FRIDAY March 16, 2018 Early bird option members depart for the Talladega Super Speedway. Other tour attendee's arrival and check in at the motel. Visit local antique stores looking for those great finds you just cannot do without. The fun will continue Friday evening with the welcome dinner at 6:00 p.m. with some good "ole" Model "A" fellowship, 50/50 drawing, picking and grinning with the Dan Nelson Players in Gerald Grizzard's Model "A" Ford Museum, 1 mile from the host motel.

SATURDAY March 17, 2018. ## Model A Q&A's

The shop is as full as always. Sometimes I have a tough time getting through the door in my wheelchair. But that's okay, I love the work and love to see all those classic cars. Here are some Questions and Answers from the last few weeks.

# Q: I am in the process of restoring my 1929 Briggs body Fordor. I'm having a tough time getting the doors to close properly. What's the trick?

**A:** I wish there was a trick, it's really just a lot of hard work to get the body lined up properly on any Model A after it's been apart for paint. First make sure your frame is perfectly straight. You can check this with a long straight edge. The frames usually sag near the motor mounts. We usually start at the radiator and work our way back. Allow a couple of days and plenty of head scratching to get everything right. Here is an excellent article I found on the Internet: www.abarnyard.com/workshop/door-1.htm

#### Q: The speedometer on my 1930 Coupe is not working properly. Sometimes it just sweeps back and forth, and sometimes I get a loud screaming noise like the transmission is going to fall out or something.

**A:** That sounds like your speedometer cable. You could probably fix it by dropping the instrument panel, then unscrew the cable from the back of the speedometer, then pull the center cable out of the housing. There are some special lubricants available, but regular axle grease will work just fine. Be careful, the cable is about 6 feet long so don't let it touch your upholstery. Slide the cable back down through the housing while coating it with a thin layer of grease. That should solve your problem.

## **TECHNICAL TOPICS**

## Q: Whenever I park my Model A in the garage overnight, my wife complains of the smell of gasoline. I always shut off the fuel valve, but it leaks a few drops anyway. What can I do?

A: This is a very common problem with our beloved Model A's. The fuel system is a simple gravity flow design. This has been very reliable for the last 80+ years. The car is designed with 2 valves to stop fuel flow when the car is not running. #1 is the fuel valve under the gas tank. #2 is the float valve inside the carburetor. If you are leaking gas overnight, then both of these valves are probably leaking. There are rebuild kits available for the valve under the tank, but we always just replace them with a new one. Then replace the float valve inside the carburetor with an original style valve and you should be leak-free. Let me know.

# Q: I drive my 1931 Sport Coupe nearly year-round. We get lots of enjoyment out of it going to visit family, and I always drive it to coffee on Saturday morning. I keep having to replace the cork float on the fuel gauge. This is not a big job, but it seems like I have to do this every year. What's going wrong?

**A:** I am glad you are enjoying your car. Wish everybody would drive them more. You are probably using regular fuel in your car. You can get by with this since you are driving it so often. The ethanol in the fuel is attacking your cork float. There are neoprene and brass floats available which will solve your problem. Try one next time you change your float. These will stand up to the ethanol in your fuel just fine. I recommend ethanol-free fuel.
