



THE SHADE TREE A'S - THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The November 1988 issue of the Shade Tree A's Newsletter is packed with a lot of information. There's a crossword puzzle, another photo from the trip to Abbeville, an answer to the mystery photograph from the previous Newsletter, an announcement for the upcoming "Wishing It Were Spring Rally", fashion news, and more. Of particular note is the story of Ralph Neitzke's first Model A, repeated here in its entirety.

Ralph Neitzke and I were talking last meeting when the subject of his first Model A came up. It was 1965 and Ralph, then just out of high school, had talked his Dad into letting him get an old car (wonder if Ralph's Dad had the same idea mine did and same justification for his mother don't worry he'll never get that old piece of junk running). Well, that old piece of junk just happened to be a '30 Model A pickup.

The car being about seventy miles away, Ralph had to tow it home (how many of us had trailers in 1965?). All went well till just a couple of miles from the house when some old rubber finally gave out! Not having a spare and being just a stone's throw from home, Ralph very carefully finished the job on metal instead of rubber.

Getting it home was the easy part - Ralph with youthful enthusiasm jumped into the project head first so to speak by getting everything ahead of the firewall in working order. From that day in April till the month of November things went well, then - a personalized invitation from the President of the U.S. came bringing work on the truck to a screaming halt.

Unfortunately, Ralph's Dad had nowhere to keep it so the truck went up for sale - Ralph's \$75.00 dream went one way and Ralph went where Uncle Sam sent him. TECHNICAL TOPICS

Oil Filter Installation

About a year ago I decided to purchase an oil filter kit for my Model A Tudor. I heard many pros and a lot of cons concerning the efficiency of an oil kit. So I shelved my kit for over a year until I finally decided to pull the trigger on an installation.

First of all, the oil kit cost about \$185.00 delivered. You will also need a new manifold gasket for about \$5.00 (removed a two piece and replaced with a one piece). Everything else in the kit is included with a new modern spin on filter. You will need a socket set, adjustable pliers, and a putty knife to remove the old gaskets that sometimes don't come off real easy.

Remove your carb and then your manifold and just let it fall down gently. No need to remove the clamp that holds the manifold to the muffler. Then remove the valve cover and install the copper tube in the small gallery where the oil enters the valve chamber. The only adjustments made were to cut a small copper pipe to fit in the recess. The new valve chamber cover comes with a new gasket. Be careful not to "pinch" the paper gasket and also add a little oil on the rubber filter seal. Replacing the manifold gasket to me was a no brainer and 45 foot pounds of torque was used. All told this job took about 2 hours to complete and in my estimation a valuable asset to my engine life.
