





THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

The August 1989 issue of the Shade Tree A's Newsletter discussed the upcoming August Family Meeting which was held at Quincy's Steakhouse on Washington Road back then. Also discussed was the upcoming trip to Jacksonville, Florida. Tentatively planning to travel was noted as Ralph and Tina Neitzke, Richard and Frankie Dunevent, Bob and Billy Jones and possibly Monroe and Betty Wade. A technical "tidbit" advocated the use of brake fluid as a rubber treatment (just be careful around paint). The Newsletter included two articles reprinted from other sources. One that lamented that the Model A was no longer in production and another that encouraged antique car owners to consider the direction the old car hobby is headed. TECHNICAL TOPICS

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

The award winning restoration of Gary Russolillo's 1931Model A Ford De Luxe Roadster is on the cover of the Antique Automobile magazine, the official publication of the Antique Automobile Club of America (Vol 83, Number 4, July/August 2019). The story of the restoration and pictures are on pages 52-55. You might enjoy looking at them.

For those of you who do not subscribe to the Model A Times magazine, there is a report from the Silver GHOST Association (Rolls-Royce) documenting massive cooling system failures apparently caused by certain antifreeze products. "The antifreeze that can be used safely in our cars uses an older fashioned Inorganic Additive Technology (IAT) additive. You can tell by the color of the antifreeze if it's safe to use. Also, the product may be labeled "Safe for Older Cars" - meaning 10 years old or more. Brands to be avoided are all Prestone lines and Zerex's G-05 in the gold container. Avoid any "extended life" antifreeze. None of us wants to pull and rebuild our cars' engines. Acceptable brands are Peak, Peak's HD Product "Sierra", and Zerex Original Green in the white container. If any of the OAT, H-OAT, or N-OAT products are in your car, the cooling system should promptly be drained - radiator and block - the system flushed thoroughly, and IAT antifreeze installed. The failures they are reporting are to gaskets and gasket cements. Many of us stopped using these products in our Model A's long ago, when overheating issues resulted in geysers spraying our hoods, fenders and windshields with antifreeze, and the antifreeze leaving the paint damaged.


