

THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

The December 1989 issue of the Shade Tree A's Newsletter contained a full page story about a firsttime Model A driving experience. The November 1989 Newsletter threw out some ideas for what to get the Model A'er - the December 1989 Newsletter contained a sequel dealing with what the Model A'er should <u>NOT</u> get those who put up with his or her vehicular obsession. For instance, if they say they want something personal, don't get a lap blanket with the Ford script emblazoned on it. "Something that glitters" definitely doesn't mean new hubcaps or chrome plated head nuts!

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

The Model A Ford may have a unique, but common problem. One of the two bolts holding the starter Bendix may shear off. This may be more prevalent on Model A's converted to 12 volts, but I can assure you it is also common on Model A's still equipped with the original 6 volt electrical system. Some think that not fully retarding the spark before starting the car is also a culprit.

The Bendix is held onto the starter shaft with two similar but different bolts. They have a fine shallow thread. Each has a unique tabbed lock washer. When one of these bolts shears off, or backs out due to the use of an incorrect lock washer, a sharp sudden noise like a 22 rifle firing is heard. You have just lost your ability to start the motor with the starter, and while driving, you will unexpectedly hear this noise again and again. While there have been many ingenious attempts to retrieve the bolt, fishing with a magnet, adhesive on the flywheel, etc., many resort to removing the transmission to retrieve the bolt. In severe cases, the bolt can wedge and lock the engine down.

A modern cure for the problem is a newer type Bendix which fits the 5/8" (original) starter shaft. This Bendix uses a metal sleeve to cover the Bendix spring and bolts to prevent them from shearing off. It is fairly simple to replace, except for a strong spring which must be compressed to install the Bendix. A special spring compressor is available to accomplish this, but it adds to the expense. The Bendix can be installed by using two slotted screwdrivers to pry a washer back, to compress the spring, to expose a set screw, align and tighten. It can be done, but be fair warned, the spring is heavy duty. Just ask Tom Roberts.

Model A Headlights

Now that the winter days are getting shorter we find ourselves having to use our headlights on our beloved Model A's more often. We want to see as well as be seen by other drivers. Unfortunately the original 6 volt Ford headlight bulbs just don't seem to "throw out" enough light to suit the average Model A enthusiast. There are halogen bulbs but they create heat as well as light and are adequate for most. The bulb that I highly recommend is the LED bulb and comes in 6 and 12 volts for all Model A years. Fortunately, the LED bulbs draw very few amps off either your generator or the newer alternator. They fit perfectly well in the standard Model A headlight socket. Happy motoring all.






