In lieu of our regular technical program, I'm told Mother Nature provided her own with an elaborate display of springtime showers. Below is a synopsis of the activity outside as observed by Iim McPherson:

"It is amazing what you can accomplish with a small group like we had Monday night. And Darrell's lack of a program turned into a real plus. We had two almost identical Model A's just outside the garage door. WE got to observe firsthand how these tops handle rain water. Heavy rain bounces off the tops pretty good if the top is stretched tight. And I guess the chicken wire helps too. We documented how the tops leak, from the front and rear corners and later to the side panels. And you should see the large hail bounce off the tops! What was more amazing was the difference the hail made when hitting the hood and gas tank. It didn't bounce as much when hitting the gas tank. I don't know if it is made of a thicker gauge metal or not. That gave Andrew a chance to talk about removing small dents using suction, which doesn't damage the paint. I told them about the use of dry ice to do the same thing. All in all, it turned out to be a good program".

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:10 PM, obviously a new record for the shortest STA meeting ever in our history! Fortunately, the always delicious and bountiful refreshments were provided by Misty Hooker (for the Gordons). Thanks Misty!





For Christmas 2017 I asked my better half for a shortened Pittman arm. Almost a year went by and I finally installed said arm. I drive my Tudor as much as I can with just the usual problems found on an almost 90-year-old car. About a month ago my vehicle hit a large pothole and I experienced the "death wobble." I asked one of our seasoned Shade Tree A's members and he said it might be the king pin bushings. So I jacked up the front end and that was not the problem. I did discover that the drag link bolt that captures the Pittman arm ball was seriously loose.

So again when you are checking for safety issues with your "driver", check your tie rod and drag link ends to ensure they are tight and won't come off. This could definitely ruin your day.





THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

The May 1989 issue of the Shade Tree A's Newsletter contained a news article about an event involving a Moscow traffic cop. The Newsletter also welcomed the newborn daughter of members Larry and Dawn Komp. A diagram of a very unique Model A engine modification was also included. The reason for the modifications was not provided but was promised for the next Newsletter. A reprint of an article from the August 1953 issue of the *Ford Times* described the restoration of a 1929 Model A and construction of two other modified "Fords".





TECHNICAL TOPICS

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.


Like many things, a catastrophic failure is usually easily spotted. But try locating a slow drain on your Model A battery. When this happens, many of us grab our ohm meter to locate the problem. But an ohm meter may be too sensitive to locate the problem. The answer to locating the problem may be the simple light bulb. If your Model A has a six volt electrical system, then use a six volt light bulb. And if it has been converted to twelve volts, use a twelve volt light bulb. Disconnect the active battery cable (in the case of a positive ground system, the negative side is the active side) from the battery terminal and connect the appropriate light bulb between the active cable and the battery terminal. If the bulb glows, or burns brightly, there is an electrical drain or open circuit (short to ground). A dim glow indicates a smaller short, while a bright glow indicates a larger short. Now, disconnect each circuit one at a time. When the light goes out, you have located the problem circuit. Make the necessary repair(s), reconnect the wire(s) and test again. No glow from the light bulb means you have repaired the electrical short. I like to totally disconnect all wires from the battery, then add them back into the circuit one at a time to locate the short. The most common places for shorts to occur are the headlamp connections, the stop light switch, especially the 1928-29 style, and the horn.

Tiny Tips - Horn Lubrication

Lubricating their horn is one item that some people overlook. There are two felt pads at the armature area of your horn. Put two (2) drops of 3-1 type oil on each felt oiler pad about two times a year and this will help keep your horn working.

DO NOT OVER OIL.
