



THE SHADE TREE A'S - THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

TECHNICAL TOPICS

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

Gaskets fill the space between two mating surfaces to provide a seal and prevent leakage from or into joined surfaces. The gasket is used to fill the imperfections in the mating surfaces. Gaskets are manufactured out of many different materials because they serve different purposes. Gasket adhesives can be used to improve their sealing ability. Where large amounts of heat are generated, the cylinder head, manifold and exhaust pipe gaskets are made of asbestos, copper lined with asbestos or steel lined with asbestos. The compressibility of the gasket material is an important factor.

The cylinder head gasket has received much attention lately. Blown head gaskets are being blamed on either higher compression heads, poor gasket materials/construction, or both. The copper clad gaskets are still considered best for our Model A's. However, the fill material between the copper sheets may have changed. When installing a head gasket, make sure you remove all foreign material. Check for warpage or distortion by placing a straightedge lengthwise on the head. Slide a feeler gauge between the straightedge and head to determine if there is any warpage. If there is more than 0.006", have the head surfaced. Check the new head gasket for proper fit. Should you use a gasket sealer? Theoretically you should not need one. I always use a sealant. There are several brands available, Permatex Copper, Fel-Pro Spray Tack and K & W Copper Coat. Only a thin layer should be applied, and allowed to tack before installation. They help fill the imperfections in these old mating surfaces. Aluminum spray paint makes a good sealer, and should be used with an aluminum head. In the old days, a thin coat of grease was used as a sealer. This is not a good idea. As the engine heats up to operating temperature, the grease turns to a liquid, and may be forced out from between the mating surfaces by the engine compression. The result is a blown head gasket.


