



Model A Story

My Model A Ford History

In 1962 John F. Kennedy was president, gas was 28 cents a gallon, I was turning 11 years old and this is where my story begins. I had several school classmates that were throwing newspapers and making 15 to 20 dollars per week. That sounded good to me so I applied and got a route near my home. One of my customers happened to have several Model A Fords in their backyard and I inquired if they were for sale. I purchased my first car for 10 dollars down and 10 dollars per week for 9 weeks. At the end of those long weeks, the car was officially mine!! I spent all of my free time tearing the car apart and restoring the chassis. Soon after I found a running 1931 Town Sedan in Blackville, South Carolina for 100 dollars. Since I had no driver's license, my father drove the car to Augusta without a muffler, brakes, working starter and 2 quarts low on crankcase oil. Three weeks later someone saw my car located in my dad's downtown warehouse and offered me 300 dollars but I wasn't having any thoughts of selling my just acquired Model A.

Fast forward 5 years and I had purchased 3 more Fords. One was a 1930 Town Sedan that I purchased off Lumpkin Road for 400 dollars which Bob Jones helped me restore. I traded him the 1931 slant window Town Sedan that now lives at Richard Dunevent's Garage.

In 1980 the mortgage interest rate went to 20 percent so I thought it a good time to sell my last Model A to Joe Holley. Jim McPherson now owns that 1930 Town Sedan 🚘 !!

For many years I was "Model A-less" but I never lost my desire to own another one. That brings us to 2016 when I purchased Chuck Howell's 1930 Tudor Sedan. I have pictures of the "before" and "after" and you can see a striking difference. When it is 100 degrees in July, I tell my wife that driving my A is the most fun I've ever had with my clothes on.



TECHNICAL TOPICS

Clean Those Wheels

Originally submitted by Tony Topicz and previously published in the AaaOOOgah newsletter, Ohio Valley Region.

Here is a very simple and easy way to clean spoked wheels. Buy a good brand of "Foam Bathroom Cleaner" to spray on your wheels. After spraying, wait a few minutes to let the cleaner soak in and to penetrate the dirt. Rinse off with a garden hose and you should have clean and shiny wheels.

Front Wheel Bearing Installation and Adjustment

Jim's Tech Tip - Model A Ford Club of America

1. See that front hub, inner and outer bearings are packed with grease.

2. Front hub washer should slide over threads on spindle body with fingers (loose fit).

3. Install nut and tighten it while slowly turning the brake drum so that all component parts are pulled together snugly; that is, inner and outer bearings will be snug in cones, washer is tight against outer roller bearing, and nut tight against washer. (There will be a slight drag when drum is turned.) Not over 8-10 ft-lbs of torque is required to get these results.

4. Turn nut BACK two castle slots (this is approximately 1/4 turn of nut); insert cotter pin and try bearings for a slight side play and a free spinning drum or wheel.


Don't forget the cotter pin! The nut will back out and the wheel will come off. That will totally spoil your Model A Day!

Cooling System Treatment

While at the Shade Tree A's Christmas Party, I was talking to Paul Ianuario, Ernie Dinkins' brother-in-law. He told me about a cooling system treatment that greatly reduced the temperature of his early Ford V-8 car. It's called RMI-25 Cooling System Treatment. The product was originally developed for and used by commercial fleet operators. According to their website:



It cleans while you drive; inhibits rust, cavitation erosion, electrolysis and pitting; lubricates water pump seals and thermostats; and improves cooling.

If you're having cooling system problems, you may want to consider this product. If you do use RMI-25, let us know about your experience.
