



Day Trip to Rivers Bridge State Historic Site Ehrhardt, South Carolina Saturday, May 2, 2020

The Shade Tree A's are meeting up with the Live Oak A's from Savannah, the Aiken A's, the Old Ninety-Six District Model A Club, the Palmetto A's of South Carolina and the Low Country Model A Club for a picnic at Rivers Bridge State Park on May 2, 2020. Last year's picnic at Magnolia Springs State Park near Millen was great family entertainment. This year we want to add some Model A games to the "menu", so stay tuned for more info.

Rivers Bridge State Historic Site marks the site of one of the Confederacy's last stands against General William T. Sherman's sweep across the South. Of all the Civil War Sites in South Carolina, the Battle of Rivers Bridge is the only one in the State Parks system that is home to a preserved battlefield.

A ¾-mile guided trail details the Battle of Rivers Bridge by way of interpretive panels along the trail. Ranger-guided tours of one of the most well-preserved Civil War sites in South Carolina, which includes still-intact earthen fortifications, are also given throughout the year.


THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO

TECHNICAL TOPICS

And the Model A Ford Kept Rambling Right Along

This column contains maintenance, diagnostic, and technical tips to aid you in keeping your Model A on the road and operating at peak performance. I have stolen this information from a variety of sources, including forums, websites, books, publications, and discussions with fellow Model A owners.

"MODEL 'A" FORD BRAKES - Details of a COMPLETE Brake Job" is the cover title for Skinned Knuckles, February 2020 (Volume 44 – NO. 2). The article, "Model "A" Ford Brakes SERVICE, MAINTENANCE, REBUILDING (Six Shoe System)" by Paul Moller, is on pages 29-34. I had the pleasure of meeting Paul too many years ago, and a long friendship began. This article is reprinted from Skinned Knuckles (November 1979) and is still accurate today. My memory must be failing me. It is surprising how replacement parts, such as the front brake roller tracks, were available back then, over forty years ago. This issue focused on the front brakes. Servicing and rebuilding the rear brakes and emergency brakes, and brake adjustment will be in the March 2020 issue of *Skinned Knuckles*.

Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon Check Your Oil Filler Pipe and Cap

Many Model A owners experience excessive oil leaks when driving their car, often out the rear main seal. One simple thing that can cause this is a restriction in the oil filler pipe. Take the cap off and look down the pipe with a good light. You should only see a series of little metal baffles, half-moon in shape, inside the filler pipe. If you find where someone has covered the pipe with a sock, or stuffed a piece of cloth down in the filler pipe to stop oil from coming out the filler when driving, this will put pressure inside the crankcase and force oil out the rear main seal while you drive. Easy to fix: get that stuff out of there!



While you have it off, also inspect the inside of the oil filler cap. It, too, needs to be clear inside. No pieces of steel wool, pot scrubber, or old sock in the cap! Look for evidence of someone accidentally pushing the oil filler cap on too far. When you do, you bend the little tabs inside the cap and mash it all the way down on the pipe. This blocks the engine's ability to vent the crankcase, builds up pressure, and causes a bad leak out the rear main seal.

I hope this little tip helps you stop that oil leak while driving. Have a Model A Day! Jim March 2020
