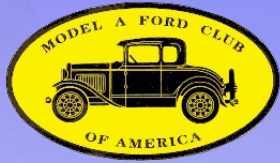

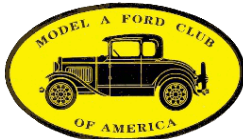

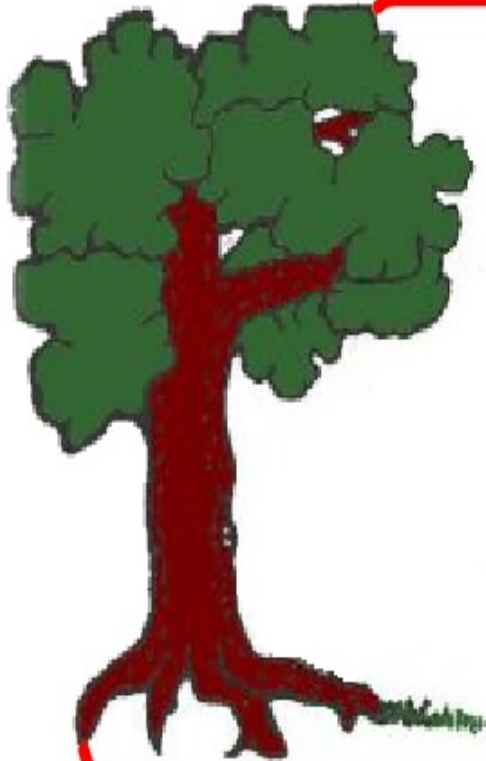

2021 Monroe Wade Award

At the February monthly meeting, Don Turley was presented with the Monroe Wade Award for 2021. The text of the presentation introducing Don as the recipient is included below.

This year's recipient of the Monroe Wade Award has been a long time member and past president of the Shade Tree A's. Many members of the Shade Tree A's have relied upon his expertise and assistance when restoring their cars. His knowledge and expertise has qualified him to judge in national shows since 1992 and to obtain the title of Master Judge in MAFCA Blue Ribbon Fine Point Judging and Senior Judge in MARC [Don is actually a Master Judge in MARC also, Ed.]. He was also selected to serve on the MARC Judging Standards Committee in 2005.

He has been generous in sharing his knowledge through the effort of the Model A Ford Foundation. He assembled and donated a set of tools for display at the MAFFI museum and was also instrumental in providing the custom cabinetry for the display. He has helped ensure the Model A hobby is passed along to the next generation by assisting a young man in the restoration of his own Model A. He went out of the way to coordinate the engine rebuild for the young man's car including personally delivering the engine to the young man who lives in another state. He has shared his knowledge with the Shade Tree A's through presentations at monthly meetings.

He has participated in numerous tours with the Shade Tree A's over the years and has demonstrated the reliability and drivability of the Model A automobile by driving great distances. These trips included driving his Model A from his home in Evans in 1990 to the Model A Restorer's Club National Meet in Dearborn, Michigan.

It is with pleasure that we award the 2021 Monroe Wade Award to Don Turley.

Yes, Your Model A Can Stop on a Dime...Learn How

Eric Shogren presented an outstanding technical program on Model A brakes for the first Saturday Technical Session of the year. The technical session was held at Richard's garage on March 26, 2022. If you missed it, you missed out on a lot of great information on probably the most important system of our Model A's. Eric covered the design, operation, maintenance and rebuilding of Model A brakes from "front to rear". Eric discussed the tools needed to service Model A brakes and what to look for when inspecting them. Several members also brought tools they have made for adjusting the brakes on their own cars. Many common areas of wear to parts that often need replacement were covered during the technical session. Adjustment of the brakes were discussed including proper alignment of the various brake levers and centering of the brake shoes. After the tabletop presentation was complete, the group headed outside to adjust the brakes on Steve Spencer's Coupe. Everyone enjoyed a lunch provided by the Club and prepared by Sheila McPherson. Thank you Eric and Sheila!

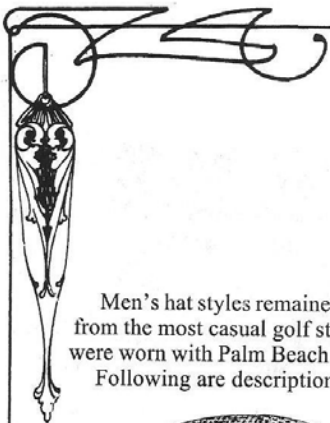

Men's hat styles remained the same through the four years of the Model "A" era. There were hats for every occasion, from the most casual golf style hat to go with knickers, to the top hat with formal evening tails. Straw hats for summer were worn with Palm Beach suits. Derbys or fedoras were worn with business suits. For every job there was a work hat. Following are descriptions and examples of men's hats which were used during the Model "A" era.



All Wool:
Hand shaped and hand blocked of fine all wool top coating material. One piece top with warm inband for cold weather. Fancy medium brown plaid and fancy medium gray plaid.

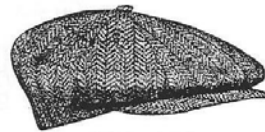


All Wool One-Piece Kersey

One Piece Kersey:
Solid one piece style all wool kersey cloth, satin lined with warm inband and unbreakable visor. Colors: bluish gray and tan.



All Wool:
All wool with a soft nap closely resembles camels hair. Patterns are dressy and refined. Satin lined. Colors: medium gray and medium tan.



Wool and Silk:
About 2/3 wool, balance silk. Full cotton twill lined. Colors: gray and brown.

New Snappy Collegiate Cap

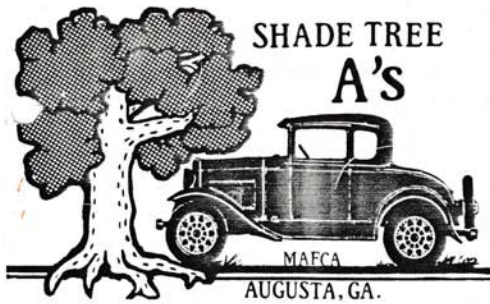


Collegiate Cap:
Smaller shape 3/4 wool, balance rayon. All around leather sweatband. No inband. Colors: fancy grey and tan.



Adjustable:
Adjust the buckle in front to fit head. Tailored of a swagger plaid material 2/3 wool. Genuine leather sweatband in front, satin lined. Colors: fancy bluish gray plaid, fancy tan plaid.

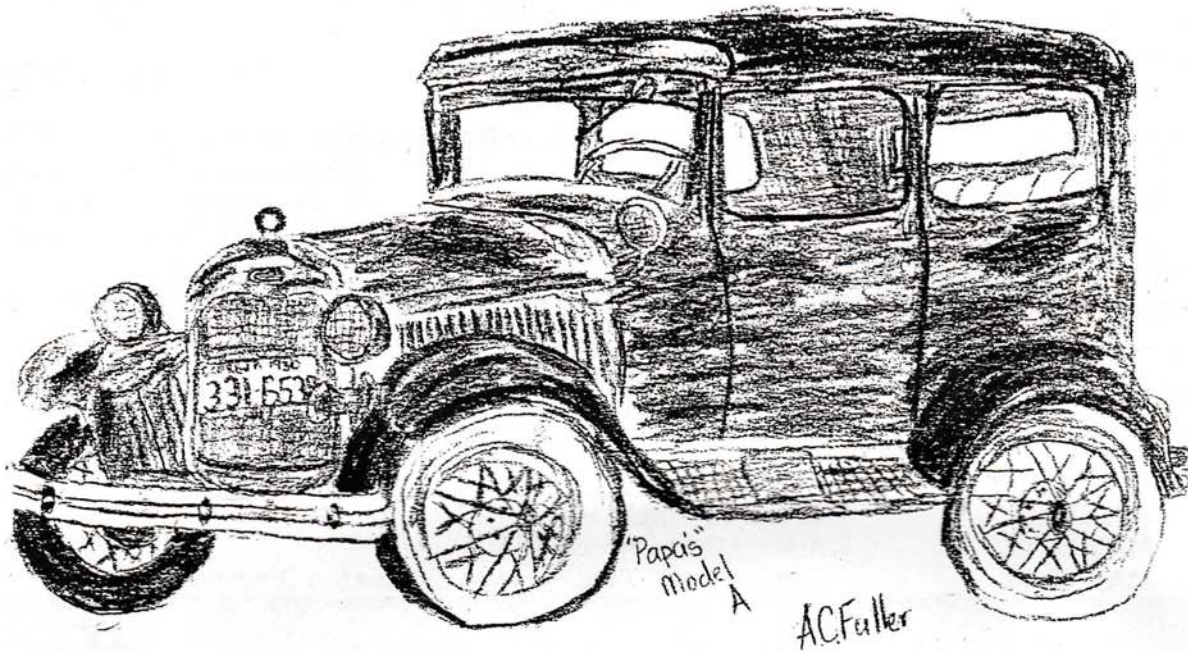
THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO

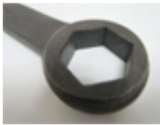
"The Right Tool for the Job" - Part 1

I've been working with a new Model A mechanic lately, which reminded me of some basics on choosing the right tool for the job. Today we talk about choosing wrenches and sockets for use on nuts and bolts. The thing that determines your choice is how well you need to grip the hex, to allow you to apply the torque (twist) you need... and your access to the nut or bolt head.

Best Grip

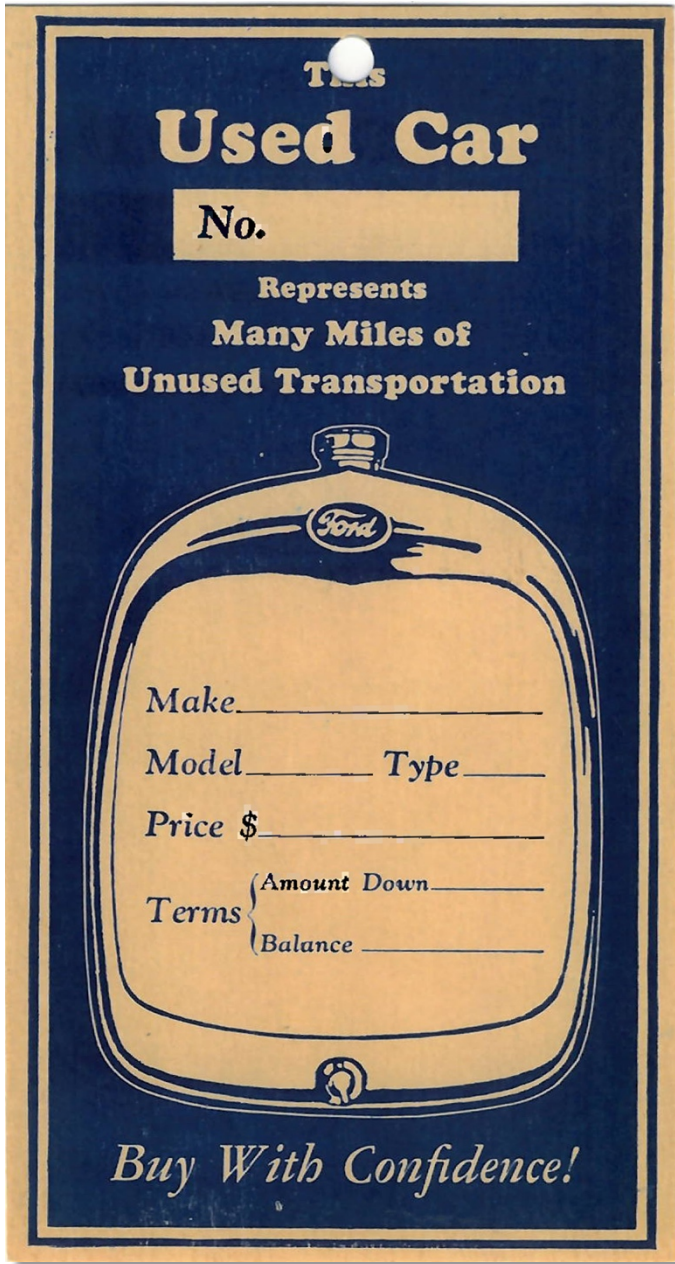

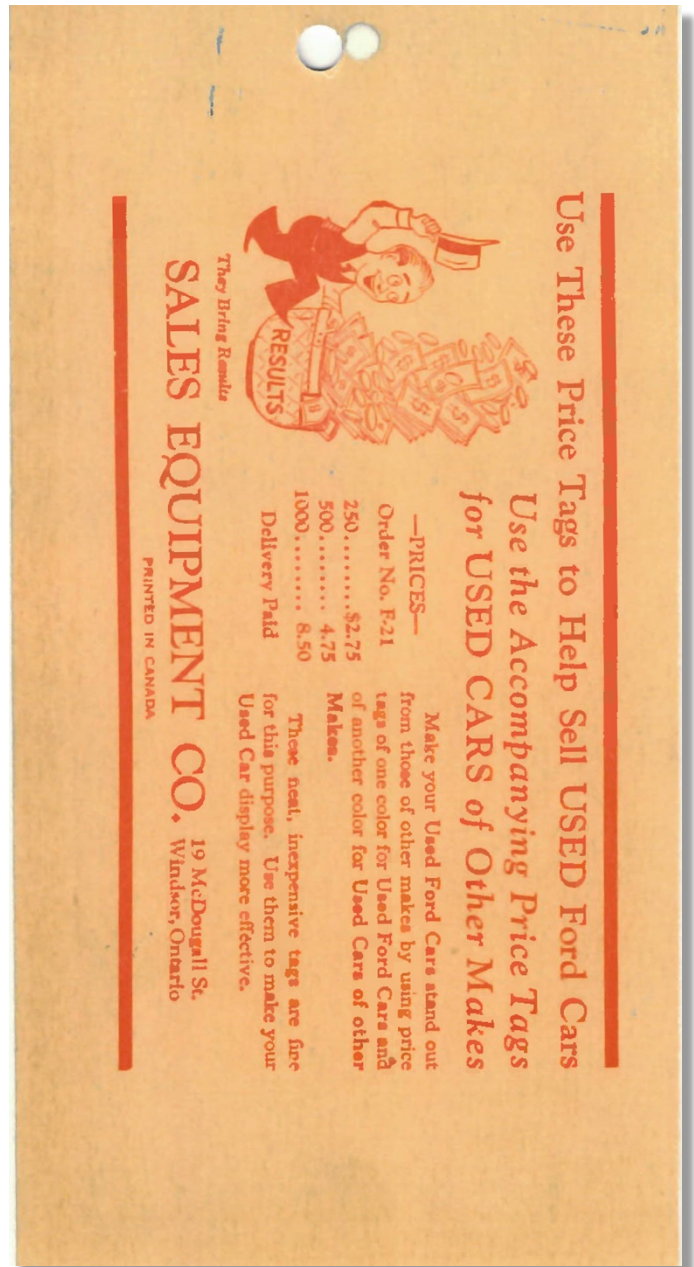
