Flying Quail Presidents Article – November 2023

MAFCA once again had a presence at the Hershey Swap Meet in Hershey, PA from October 3 – 6. Office Manager Sandra Aguirre along with Chet Wojick, SR, Doug & Nan Linden, Kay Lee, Jay McCord and Wayne Champagne led the charge manning the tent and providing daily seminars on relevant Model A topics. By all accounts they did a great job. Thanks to all for their service to MAFCA and especially to Jay McCord for filling a vacancy on short notice.

As I'm writing this article, I notice on my calendar that MAFCA's annual anniversary is just a few days away. Saturday, October 21 marks our 66th Annual Anniversary. I went back to the first *Restorer* newsletter published May/June 1956 for some "current" information about the beginnings. Originally MAFCA was formed as the Model A Restorers Club of Southern California, with Art Miller as president, and was part of the Model A Restorers Club of West Hartford, Connecticut which was formed in 1952. Mr. Art Grow gathered 15 members and met on October 1955 to start the process of forming a MARC regional club in Southern California. By late 1956 there were 34 members centered in Southern California. The 1st Annual Award Dinner was held at Sailee's Restaurant. Located across the street from NBC Burbank, the restaurant was noted for hosting television luminaries and stars.

On October 21, 1957, the MARC SC spun off from MARC became Model A Ford Club of America. First mention of the current MAFCA logo is in Nov/Dec 1958. The 3rd Annual Business Meeting lists 1086 members. With a yeoman's amount of work done between 1956 and 1958, MAFCA was establishing itself as a stand alone club with a growing membership. From these 15 members and one chapter, as of August 2023, membership has grown to 10, 550 in the U.S. and 283 Internationally. With 245 Chapters MAFCA is now the largest car club in the U.S. dedicated to a single model automobile.

The Restorers Class

And What it Means to You Howard Eckstein

There are many ways members of the club enjoy the hobby. For some, it is the pursuit of perfection in restoration. For others, it is modifying their cars to suit their needs or desires. For the former, the Judging Standards Committee has established benchmarks for judging cars that are restored to like-new condition.

Realizing that most of the membership doesn't or can't restore their cars to like-new condition, MAFCA set out to establish an evaluation program designed to accommodate the rest of us. The Restorers Class sets standards for the car that's considered a driver.

If you attend a convention and walk through the parking lot, you'll see hundreds of Model As with all kinds of paint schemes, accessories and modifications that reflect the personalities of their owners. Notwithstanding those differences, the basic platform of all of them is an old Model A Ford. Any effort made by their owners to keep their cars close to original deserves recognition.



In Restorers Class, points are added for everything found to be correct about a car during evaluations. Fine-point details are not considered. For example, take the carburetor. There were

many iterations of the Zenith carburetor throughout the production of the Model A. These nuances are important for those who restore their cars to like-new condition. For the Restorers Class, full points are awarded for any Zenith carburetor so long as it's black and in good condition.

Sanctioned events include conventions, regional gatherings and club tours. Official evaluations and recognitions are given at these get-togethers. But you don't have to wait to travel to one of these events to benefit from the Restorers Class. The score sheet is on the MAFCA website here: <u>https://www.mafca.com/rc/eval_score_sheet.pdf</u>.



In addition to the score sheet, the *Restorer* has been printing a column where in each issue, one of the line items on the score sheet is explored as to how it would be evaluated. Local chapters could hold their own unofficial evaluations for the benefit of their members. Take the score sheet with you when going to inspect a Model A for sale. It will give you a systematic way of looking at all the important parts of the car.

There will be sanctioned Restorers Class evaluations at the 2024 National Convention in Ruidoso New Mexico, June 23rd through the 29th. Consider taking your car there. It will probably earn more points than you may think.

THE PERFECT HAT FOR YOUR FACE SHAPE

Have you sometimes thought that you don't look good in a hat? You <u>can</u> look wonderful, if you follow the simple rule of basing your hat choice on your face shape. It has been said that the ideal face shape is the oval, but not everyone has been blessed with that shape. A triangular face differs from the oval, in that it has a pointed chin. A rectangular shape is an oval that is more squared, while a square face is like a rectangle, but a little wider or not as long.

The Oval Face:

Remembering that the design of the oval shaped face is in itself beautiful, the hat should not try to improve upon that. The hat should emphasize the beauty of the face by repeating the symmetrical curves. The crown of the hat fits close to the head and the brim takes the outline of the face.

The hat to the right has symmetrical curves and a little detail at the top of the brim.



The hat to the left is described as "a jaunty little turned back hat of apricot colored felt. One side of the brim crosses over and ends in a tiny bow".



A hat with rows of angled lines, such as the one shown here is not attractive on an oval face, as it gives the illusion of a long, peaked face.

MODEL A ERA FASHION AND STYLE

The Triangular Face:

It is suggested that in order to make a triangular face look as much as possible like an oval shape, choose a hat with an irregular brim that has some width and softening curves. This will call the eye of the viewer away from the pointed chin. Avoid hats with points arching upwards.



That hat featured on the left draws the eye out and away from a pointed chin.

This hat is similar to the one on the left.





Here is a sports hat with the advantage of a wide brim, which is softening and becoming to the woman with a triangular shaped face.

Avoid hats with peaks on the crown, as that will emphasize a pointed chin.

The Rectangular Face:

A rectangular face is essentially square at the top and the bottom. You could try a hat with a crown that is also this shape. The brim could be uneven, which results in a breaking of the length of the head very becomingly. Avoid hats that accentuate the height of the face.

The hat shown on this lady is not a good choice for her, as it elongates her face.

Jim's Tech Tips

"Ignition Misfires"

We've all experienced it. When the engine is cold and first started up, the engine is running rough and you can tell not all 4 cylinders are firing. It usually clears up in under a minute. But later, when the engine is warm, you should not feel a miss when climbing a hill or accelerating into traffic. If the power is just not there, like you know it should be, where to look? It could be a carburetor problem, but don't overlook fouled spark plugs and problems in the distributor.

Check the point gap in the distributor. The cam follower wears as you drive and the point gap closes down, giving a weak spark. So check it and increase the gap back to 0.020" if needed. While you are there, look for burned points and clean them up or replace them; you might have a bad or weak condenser.

Look at the rotor. Make sure the black flat spring is touching the underside of the cap, and is not burned up. Wipe off any oil film on the rotor.

Look at the underside of the distributor cap. Inspect the graphite button on the underside. I have seen caps with the entire button broken off and missing.

Look at the inside of the distributor body (the black plastic piece). Look for an oil and dirt film on the inside. Wipe it out with a clean cloth. Look for "carbon tracks" on the inside of the cap, where the spark is jumping down to ground on the metal housing. (See photo.) Replace if needed.
