


THE SHADE TREE A'S - THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's Newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other Newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the Newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

Since the Shade Tree A's just celebrated their 50th anniversary, it should come as no surprise that 30 years ago the 20th anniversary was the major topic of discussion. In Recognition of this major milestone, a special monthly meeting was planned for June 14th for some long-term members to discuss what the Club was like in the early years... How the Club has grown... and, a few pictures of some of our more memorable moments. Club members were encouraged to bring items of interest or an interesting story concerning the Club's history.

Results of the Road Rally organized by Frank Knapp and Craig McMullin were provided. The rally was proclaimed as a well-planned and enjoyable tour. Also provided was an article on the recent tour to Redcliffe Plantation led by Monroe and Betty Wade in their 1931 Coupe. Frank Knapp drove his Speedster which was an immediate hit as evidenced by the number of kids climbing all over it and the number of people having their picture taken with it.



It was reported that Bob Jones [the Editor's father] was getting his 1931 Blind Back Fordor Sedan ready to show at the MARC National Meet in Winston-Salem. Other Shade Tree A's members also planning on attending included the Adams family, the McPherson's and Don Turley. An article by Jim McPherson described member Ed Meloan's search for a closed car for cold weather touring. Jim also provided an article on original starter switches. An article was also reprinted describing the propane-fueled 1929 Model A Speedster competing in the Great American Race.

TECHNICAL TOPICS

Houdaille Shock Absorber Patents

I thoroughly enjoyed Gerald Melchior's Technical Program on rebuilding Model A shock absorbers at the May meeting. The patent numbers stamped on the shock absorber covers intrigued me so I thought I would try to find them. The three patent numbers are 1087017, 1426115 and 1499660.

Patent number 1087017 was issued to Maurice Houdaille on February 10, 1914 for "certain new and useful improvements in shock absorbers". These improvements include devices for:

- 1. The automatic filling of any empty spaces or vacuum that may be produced for any reason in any apparatus in which liquids circulate, particularly shock absorbers for vehicles
- 2. Adjusting the initial resistance of the shock absorbing apparatus to a given load and regulating the variation of the resistance

Patent number 1426115 was issued to Albert B. Shultz of Buffalo, New York on August 15, 1922. It is unclear if Mr. Shultz is associated with the Houdaille Company. One of the objects of this patent relates to a shock absorber that exerts practically no checking or shock absorbing effect during the middle of the stroke, thus avoiding interference with the free, easy riding of an automobile when traveling over a comparatively even roadway, but which offers considerable resistance at both ends of the stroke when the automobile is traveling over comparatively rough roads.

Patent number 1499660 was issued to Maurice Houdaille on July 1, 1924 for "improvements in liquid shock-absorbers operating by circulation of liquid the braking of which results from the resistance it encounters when passing through calibrated orifices". These improvements more particularly relate to:

- 1. The arrangement of the stuffing box insulating the shock-absorbing liquid from the exterior
- 2. The centering of the members guiding the axis of the damping blades and the lubrication of this axis in its bearing
- 3. The device of recovery of the shock-absorbing liquid after it has lubricated the friction parts
- 4. The arrangement of the air exhaust valve
- 5. The arrangement of compensating valves for the shock-absorbing or damping liquid
- 6. The arrangement on the movable braking members or on the fixed partitions limiting the work-chambers, of safety valves allowing the suppression of the super-pressures and tending to uniformly distribute on each blade the total braking stress
- 7. The arrangement of ribbed-shoes for guiding the blades


Gerald mentioned a lot of these features and improvements during his Technical Program. The drawings on the next page are a few of the drawings from the patents which show some of these features.


