

Collars, Cuffs, Sleeves and Belts

The season is changing, and once again last year's wardrobe is in good condition but could be improved by an update. So, as a fashionable, but budget minded woman of the Model A era, what can you do? As always, the fashion industry has a solution for you, it's not a new idea, but it still works wonders with your wardrobe. You can purchase, or make, new collars, cuffs, sleeves, or belts for that perfect update.



No. 7-Belt, Collar and Cuff Set Green felt is piped with tan in this fourpiece set, the narrow strip of tan simply being placed beneath the edges of the green and stitched flat, since no edges need be turned. Felt flowers trimming set are four layers deep, tacked flat with a small wooden bead forming the center of each. The bottom layer is yellow, the next tan, the top yellow. Such a set gives a distinctive touch to tailored frocks. BELT, COLLIAR & CUFF JET The collar and cuff set on the left side of this picture is said to be "the most desirable style of the season." It is made of white linen, trimmed with lace and sells for 49 cents.

The second collar and cuff set is made of semi stiff white cotton with lace edging. This lovely collar sells for 39 cents.

The Charles William Stores, Inc., Fall and Winter, 1928-29

This belt, collar, and cuff set, shown in the April 1929 issue of *Woman's World* is featured as one of "the newest ideas for accessories which are easily and quickly made." The entire set, with its subtle simplicity, is made from felt.

In the June 1930 *McCall Style News,* it was noted that "the mode has definitely gone feminine, these softening and flattering accessories play a very important part in the chic ensemble."



The collar pattern shown here was available in small, medium and large sizes. The recommended fabrics were chiffon, pique or lingerie lawn. They were sure to add femininity and grace to the right frock with their flowing lines.



This sleeve pattern came in 6 sizes. Note the short puff sleeve in the upper left corner. The pattern description notes that "with the advent of the short sleeve many a frock may be remodeled attractively and made to serve another season."




This smart collar and cuff pattern came in one size. The recommended fabrics were organdie, flat crepe or satin; some with hand embroidery, others had picoted edges or were finely pleated.

The pattern included blue transfers and sold for 35 cents.

THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's Newsletters are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other Newsletters, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the Newsletters. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

The September 1993 issue of the *Shade Tree A's Newsletter* announced that the Shade Tree A's had been invited to participate in the first annual Historic Augusta Antiques Show to be held at the Bell Auditorium. I wonder if there were any other subsequent annual antique shows. The *Newsletter* also announced that club member Gary Stroebel was going to present a program on wood graining at the September meeting.

The annual Great Steak Cookout at Glenn and Verna Boswell's was reported to be a great success. Over 45 Shade Tree A's members were in attendance to enjoy the steaks obtained by Roger Dozier. The steaks were cooked on new cookers made bv Steve Brannon and Monroe Wade, A variety of Model A's were there including Monroe and Betty Wade in their 1930 Coupe and Don Turley in his 1930 Tudor.

Jim McPherson's Authentically Speaking article provided a list of causes for a missing engine.

ENGINE MISSES REGULARLY IN ONE CYLINDER WHEN IDLING

Due to Ignition Wiring

- Loose or corroded high tension terminal or cable socket.
- Cracked, oil soaked, wet, chafed or worn high tension cable insulation.
- 3. High tension cable not connected.
- 4. Broken wire inside of cable.
- 5. Stray cable strand shorting spark plug.

Due to Spark Plug

- Spark plug operating too cold, causing fouling.
- Spark plug operating too hot, causing re-ignition.
- Fouled plug due to engine oil passing piston rings.
- Fouled plug due to its being loose in cylinder head.
- Fouled plug due to damaged or ineffective plug gasket.
- 6. Spark plug gap too wide.
- 7. Spark plug gap too narrow.
- Insulator loose in shell.
- Insulator interior coated with carbon, oil or water.
- Insulator cracked, glaze-scratched or melted, allowing carbon deposit etc., to provide path for current.
- Spark plug gap filled with oil, water or fuel.
- 12. Spark plug threads dirty.
- Spark plug shorted by some metal part out of place.
- 14. Defective radio suppressor.

Due to Valve System

- 1. Valve leaks due to faulty seating.
- 2. Warped valve face.
- 3. Shoulder on valve face.
- 4. Valve sticking.
- Valve burned.
- 6. Carbon on valve seat.
- 7. Valve pitted.
- 8. Cracked valve seat.
- Gum on valve stem.
- 10. Broken valve spring.
- Bent valve stem.
- 12. Valve stem too tight in guide.
- 13. No or incorrect tappet clearance.
- 14. Sticking rocker arm.
- 15. Broken mushroom on lifter assembly.
- 16. Valve insert loose in block.
- 17. Valve lifter screw lock loose causing valve to be held open.

Due to other Conditions


- 1. Cracked cylinder head.
- 2. Broken cylinder head gasket.
- Distributor cap insert bent, loose or badly burned.
- Air leak around intake valve stem due to excessive stem-to-guide clearance.
- Loss of engine compression in cylinder.
- Slight water leak in cylinder or combustion chamber.
- Ignition points too close with low lobe on cam and worn distributor shaft or loose bushing.




