Building Confidence Driving Your Model A Ford

I have heard more than a few times, "I'm not sure about going on a Club tour with my Model A. I may have an issue on the way with my car and be left on the side of the road miles from home". We probably all have had that feeling at one time or another so you're not alone. BUT, you have to get over it!

So, I offer one solution. Drive your car often; on a short route in a circle not far from home, even with a buddy for more confidence if that helps you. Then on each successful trip, widen the circle until the distance gets to be a few miles. On each trip <u>listen</u> to the engine, drive train, vibrations and get used to those sounds. As your circles and routes get wider and longer and the Model A sounds become consistent, common place and normal, your confidence with your Model A will grow. Now you're ready for a short tour and with each successful tour your confidence will continue to grow.

But wait, there's more. What if after all this, I'm on a club tour and all on a sudden I hear an awful ugly sound and I have to pull over on the side of the road. (I have been there more than once myself as have many other STA members.) Have no fear, on every tour there are more than a few Club members with knowledge and some spare parts that will most likely get you back on the road driving again within a few minutes. And, if that is not possible, you will not be left on the side of the road to fend for yourself. Arrangements will be made to get you and your Model A home. I hope this helps and I expect to see you on the next tour, no excuses.

Debra was a great wife, wonderful mother, and a loving grandmother who helped raise her grandchildren. She was a sweet, kind soul and will be missed by all who knew her.









Have you ever wondered what being a Trustee for the Model A Ford Foundation is all about?

The Model A Ford Foundation has 15 Trustees and the positions are nonpaid. Terms are three years in duration and term limits are 6 consecutive years. Meetings are done via Zoom, but there is a day-long face-to-face meeting in Michigan two days prior to Model A Days each year (also, travel expenses are non-reimbursable; this is 100% volunteer work).

A sampling of duties include: creating and ordering signage at the museum for displays and events, programming and maintaining inventory, and financials-- some daily. There are several committees to be chaired and worked on: day-to-day museum management, finance, fundraising, the construction expansion, the design and development of the displays, insurance, assession/deassession of vehicles, fleet maintenance, social media, solicitation of parts, tool acquisition and inventory, by-laws and job description updates, advisory, and partner museum liaisons as well as Model A Days each year (which has a huge number of subcommittees from parking to staffing the gates to managing the swap meet, the first start program, riding and driving Model A's). There are always a variety of other projects that need a manager too (ie: bus restoration, booth displays at meets, library collections, period attire collections as well as developing

national magazine articles and ideas.)

Individuals also serve as officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer and a variety of other tasks: MAFFI registrar, picking up and delivering vehicles, managing gift shop items, updating and maintaining the MAFFI website and IT systems within the museum.

These perfume sprayers resembled cigarette lighters but were totally different. *Ronson* and *Evans Company* both produced these misters. Also notice the two different sizes of the *Ronson* Perfu-Mist in the following advertisement.

The *Evans Company* produced wonderful compacts but also produced perfume sprayers. They called their smaller sprayers "Pocket Atarmist" and the larger was called the "Dresser Model Atarmist." The gift sets included the sprayer and a matching compact or perfume.

It Looks Like a Lighter, but Sprays Perfume

CPRAYING a tiny jet of perfume when Dits plunger is pushed down, a novel atomizer resembling a cigarette lighter in appearance may be carried in a woman's hand bag, it is said, without danger of spilling its contents. Its nozzle is covered with a cap which is released by a plunger. When the apparatus is closed, a groove in the plunger fits over the cap to hold it in place, while the plunger in turn must be pressed down before the cap can move. Thus, its inventors claim, the device is made air-tight and proof against leakage. To operate the atomizer, one need only press the plunger twice-once to release the cap and the second time to eject the spray of perfume. The atomizer is manufactured in two sizes-for carrying in the hand bag and for the dresser.



Resembling a cigarette lighter, this little atomizer sprays a fine jet of perfume when a plunger is pressed.

A friend, who searched for years, recently bought a new old stock Ronson sprayer in the original box with paperwork and the wire to clean the sprayer. This was a great eBay find and purchase!

Antique stores and dealers may not know or recognize these perfume sprayers. Also check eBay and look for both sizes, remember the smaller sprayer would fit in your purse and the other size would be for the dresser or vanity.

Perfume was definitely popular during our Model A years which explains the development, design and marketing of these sprayers.





A report on the Charleston tour provided many photos of Shade Tree A'ers and their cars out and about in and around Charleston.










Steve Brannan gives a careful watch as Monroe Wade fills gas tank.




Shade Tree A's at Patriots Point.


The Early Days of Car Heaters






