
News Flash: Shade Tree A's Host Tech Session in Evans

On Saturday March 29, 2025 the Shade Tree A's Model A Ford Club hosted a Tech Session on brakes at Richard's Garage in Evans, Georgia. The morning started off at the Sunrise Grill with seven STA members and one Model A in attendance. When this group arrived at Richard's Garage, well before the Tech Session start time of 9:30, many members had already arrived and were discussing the brakes on their Model A. The Tunic Dress and Skirt – A 1930-1931 Design Feature

Trying to describe your era fashion can be a real struggle. You want to be unique in your wording while describing accurately the design characteristic. Perhaps "tunic" best describes your dress.

While peplums, tiers, flounces, and panels are seen in the dresses, evening wear, and occasional suits in 1928 through 1931, the tunic dress and skirt were also seen in 1930-1931.

The tunic with its elongated lines gave a slenderizing effect to the feminine silhouette. In the dress the tunic starts at the shoulder seams and falls past waistline to below the knee. A belt often gathered the fabric slightly below the natural waistline resulting in a relaxed bodice. The tunic provides flowing shape emphasizing a relaxed and feminine look

The tunic skirt was also seen as a simple second layer of fabric falling from the waist to a length approximately two thirds to three fourths of the hem of the under skirt. A more elegant or interesting tunic skirt might include gathers, box pleats, flares, angles, tucks, and bias-cut draping layer.

The underskirt may be made of a different fabric like velvet, or a different color like black with a gray tunic.

Elaborate decorations such as beads, embroidery, and lace are often seen on the tunic layer.

Fabric weight and occasion are important considerations when designing a tunic. The tunic design for women would be seen most often in afternoon, evening, and formal settings made of summer or lighter weight chiffons and silks.

A printed canton afternoon dress with a pleated and flounced mid-length tunic- right



Whether your era looking tunic has box pleats, gathers, or other draping, fashion enthusiasts will be excited to read your description and see your beautiful find.

Jim's Tech Tip

Clutch Pedal Free Play

It is easy to forget to check the Clutch Pedal Clearance (or Free Play) now and then, but you really do need to check it. I press down gently on the pedal with just a couple of fingers, to judge how far down the pedal goes before you are pressing the throwout bearing against the clutch "fingers". If you do not have an inch of movement, follow the instructions below. A little extra free play will not hurt anything.

Clutch Pedal Clearance

The correct clearance or play for the clutch pedal is approximately 1". That is when the clutch pedal is depressed there should

be about 1" movement in the pedal before it starts to disengage the clutch.

As the clutch facings wear this clearance or movement gradually grows less. Consequently it should occasionally be checked. Under no circumstances should the car be driven without clearance or play in the clutch pedal.

Adjusting Clutch Pedal Clearance




Figure 4 Clutch Pedal Adjustment

The adjustment is easily made by removing the clevis pin (see Fig. 4) and turning the release arm rod. Screwing the rod in decreases the clutch pedal play. Screwing

the rod out increases the play. After making adjustment, be sure to replace clevis pin and cotter key.

Forgetting to keep an inch or so of clutch pedal free play can lead to premature throwout bearing failure, because the bearing is spinning all the time where the pedal is pressing it into the clutch. We don't want that. So maybe check it every time you change the oil and adjust as required.


