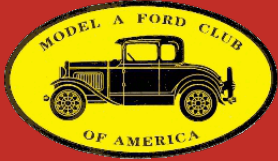

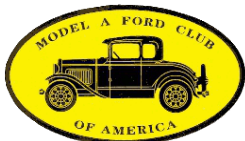

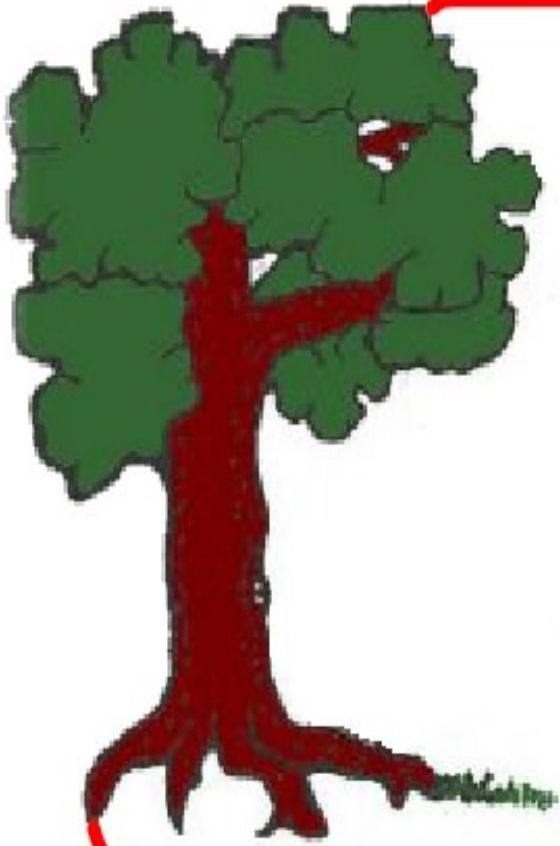

I have a list of those who requested the magnetic signs, but if you were not at the last meeting and would like to obtain one or more, please contact me. They will be available for \$10 each.

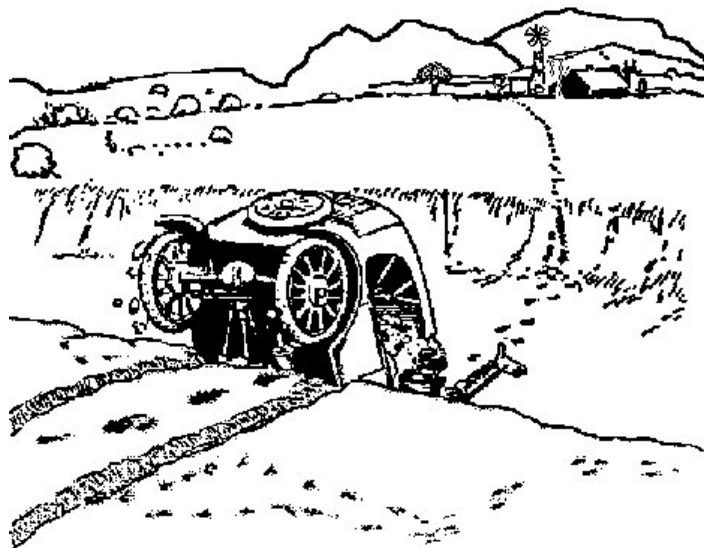

## **MODEL A ERA FASHION AND STYLE**

### **In The Girls Locker Room**

My journey to becoming the first male member of the Era Fashion Committee (EFC) started during the pandemic, by taking the six open book Fashion Judging Tests. And why not? I already had the MAFCA Fashion Guidelines. I was also participating with the EFC's Facebook group, "Model A Era Fashions – MAFCA".

Then one evening I received a call from a number I did not recognize, but I answered anyway. It was an EFC Member calling to see if I would be interested in becoming a member. My first thought was how did you get my number (probably from the MAFCA office) and why me? After a short discussion about what was a member's duty, I said give me a couple of days to think about.

I learned that the EFC is an integral part of the Model A Ford Club of America (MAFCA). It oversees the rules for judging era fashions, assists MAFCA chapters and regions with their era fashion events, and conducts extensive research on the clothing styles of the time. This committee is composed of six dedicated members, each appointed for a two-year term. With this information, I decided to write my letter of interest. I was approved by the EFC, then by the MAFCA Board and I officially became a member on July 1, 2021.

Being a member of the EFC is not just about rules and research; it's about passion and preservation. You get to connect with like-minded individuals, spread out across the county, who share a love for vintage fashion and history. The joy of seeing a perfectly recreated outfit or helping someone discover the beauty of era fashion is immensely rewarding.

I didn't just become an EFC Member; I believe I became an EFC Family Member. We would have Zoom calls for official MAFCA meetings but they would include casual conversations and laughter and being the only male member, the conversations could be quite colorful. The same is true for in-person meetings. I have placed and received many phone calls that pertained to business but would go on for 15, 20 or 30 minutes talking about nothing and everything. From taking a ghost walk tour in Fort Worth or breaking bread with all members or just one member or while waiting for a train for an hour to take two of us to the airport gave us some one-on-one time. These are the things (and there are many more) that I cherished about my two terms of service.

But what I am most proud of is my small contribution to the monumental task of defining and documenting the guidelines for the new Fashion Display Judging.

And to all the ladies of the Committee, hats off for the countless hours, months and years of work that was done without reward except for the friendships, camaraderie, fun and the pride in a job well done. We are our own support group.

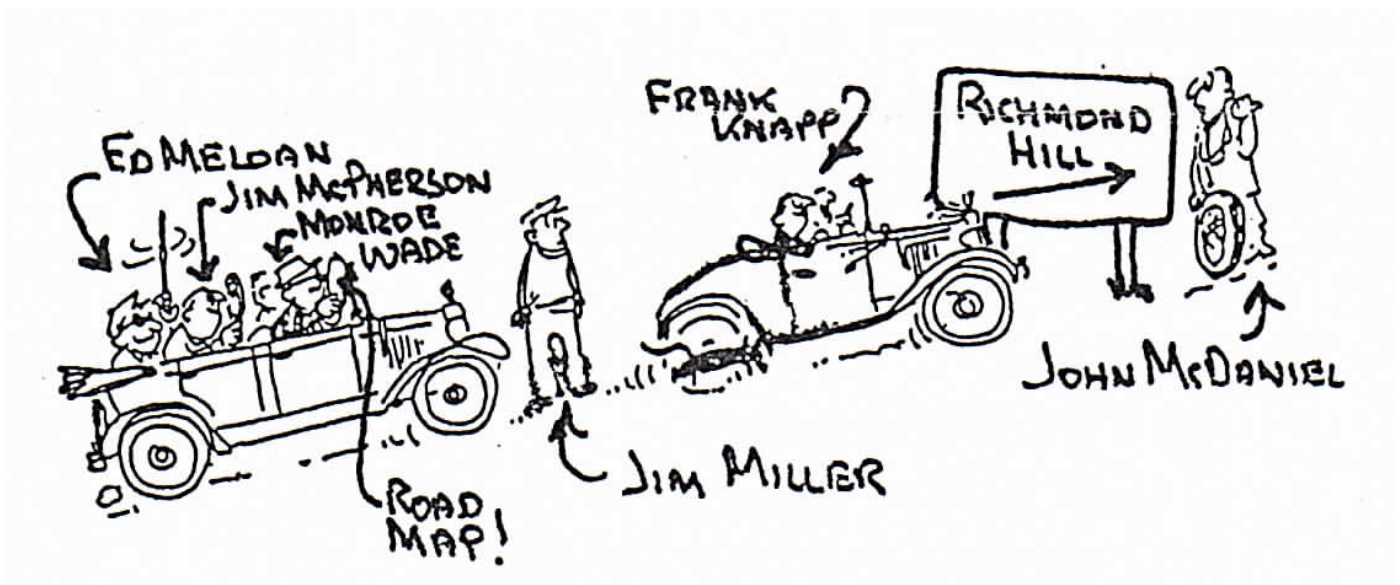
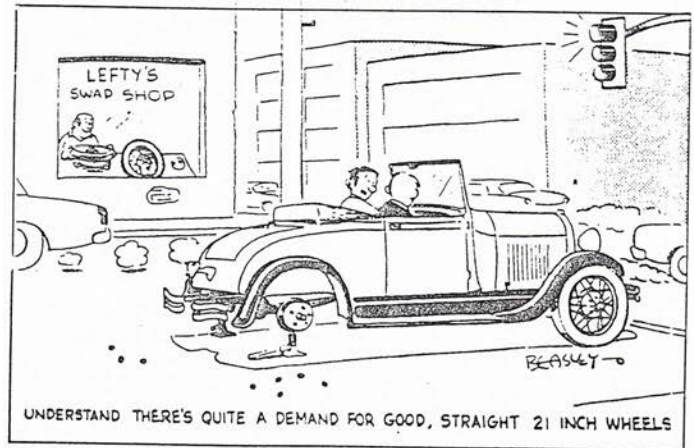
## THE SHADE TREE A'S – THIRTY YEARS AGO



The 1985-2005 Shade Tree A's *Newsletters* are now available on the Shade Tree A's website. They can be accessed via the same "button" as the other *Newsletters*, but they are password protected. The same password used to access the member roster is used to access the *Newsletters*. Thank you Dan Perla for scanning these and posting on the website.

In the March 1995 issue of the *Shade Tree A's Newsletter*, the upcoming tour to Richmond Hill was discussed. The February meeting minutes mentioned a new club project to restore the back half of a 1930 Tudor for a Texaco filling station display at the August Richmond County Museum.

The Gossip and Good Stuff column reported that Frank Knapp was busy restoring his Roadster. The new Shade Tree A's logo that appeared in the February 2025 Newsletter was reported to have more detail in the Model A. Jim McPherson's Authenticity and Troubleshooting column discussed reliability and dependability, particularly in regards to the distributor.



## TECHNICAL TOPICS

### Improving your Model A's Authenticity?

Over the past 90+ years, countless changes have shaped the identity of our individual Model A's. These vehicles have endured decades of wear and tear, from poor maintenance to the improvisations of shade-tree mechanics. For many years, the Model A wasn't the classic treasure we view it as today—it was a "beater" vehicle that somehow dodged the steel drives of World War II and kept rolling.

The scarcity of parts during the Great Depression and post-war era led to some strange and creative modifications. Spare parts were often cobbled together in configurations that strayed far from the vehicle's original design, turning the Model A into a symbol of mechanical ingenuity and survival.

When I got my Model A in 1965, it was still affordable for a young enthusiast like me. Many of my friends had Model A's in rough condition, just like mine, and we used them unapologetically as daily drivers. What stands out to me today is how dramatically things have changed—these once-neglected vehicles are now pampered and cherished.

In our local chapter, several members are dedicated to restoring their Model A's with a focus on authenticity. While achieving a perfect restoration may be out of reach for many, they strive to get as close as possible within their budget and skill level.

This is where the Restorers Class plays a vital role. Local chapter members with experience can offer informal evaluations, helping others gauge their progress and identify areas for improvement. Not everyone has the resources to take their Model A to a regional or national event for an official evaluation, but informal assessments can be just as valuable. 
